One Coroner Would Do Most Autopsies

CANTON — A plan is under consideration that would increase the duties of St. Lawrence County coroner Dr. Hugh Frame and increase his \$2,000 salary accordingly.

The plan calls for Dr. Frame, the only one of the four county coroners who is a licensed pathologist, to perform the bulk of the medical examinations required in connection with coroners' investigations.

Presently, Dr. Frame, as a coroner, can not be paid for the autopsies he performs in connections with his own investigations, and he cannot contract with another one of the coroners to do autopsies in cases which he himself does not investigate.

Yet, he is often called upon to perform such autopsies without compensation.

The plan under consideration, which also has the support of Coroner David Donaldson, would give Dr. Frame responsibility for most, if not all, of the coroner's autopsies and increase his regular coroner's salary to cover the extra duties.

According to William Collins, administration assistant to the county board of legislators, there is some \$6,000 in the budget for medical examinations. All or some of that amount could presumably be used to increase Dr. Frame's salary.

There were some legal questions involved in the plan, according to Collins, regarding whether one elected coroner's salary could be increased above the other three. Apparently, it is legally possible to increase the salary to cover the added duties.

Dr. Frame said that he would definitely like to do more autopsies and be paid for them "if possible."

He indicated, however, that the plan is only in the preliminary discussion stages at the present time.

During an executive session of the county legislature's health committee Wednesday night, the subject of coroners' salaries was raised in regard to a possible \$500 increase for all four coroners.

Reportedly, a \$500 increase for 1979

may have been discussed by the health committee, but was never included in the 1979 budget.

The new autopsy plan is expected to become a part of future discussions of coroner salaries.

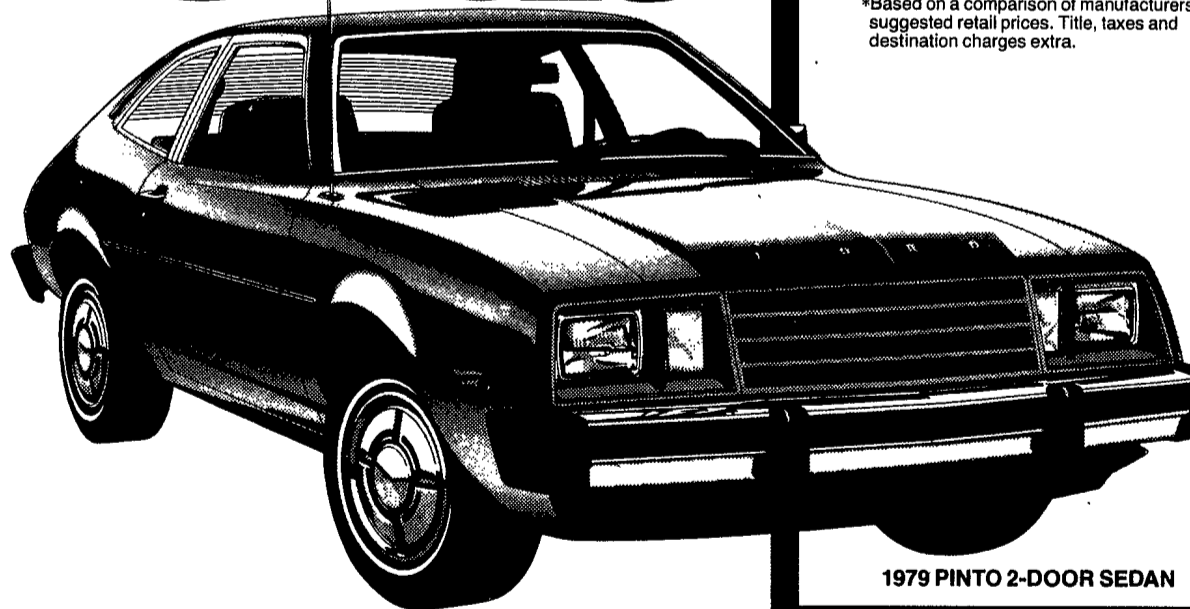
