## Bishop's Fund Totals \$535,413

OGDENSBURG — The 1978 Bishop's Fund Appeal reached a total of \$535,413 according to figures released by Father Gerald Service, director of the annual diocesan-wide appeal.

The total is 93 percent of the \$574,000 goal and 33 percent higher than the previous year's total.

The results will enable all diocesan programs regularly supported by the appeal to be funded as planned in the amount of \$424,000. In addition \$111,000 will be contributed to the Wadhams Hall Seminary College library addition fund.

The 1978 appeal saw marked increases in the amount of pledges and in the amount of matching gifts by industry. Pledges amounted to \$117,000, up from the 1977 amount of \$64,300. Matching

gifts this year were nearly \$20,000, up from \$4,500 in 1977. Matching gifts are not included in the \$535,413 total since these go directly to educational institutions.

Though the number of contributors declined this year to 27,000 from 29,000 the previous year the average gift increased to \$20 from \$14 in 1977. The number of contributors represent approximately 60 percent of the family units in the diocese.

Deanery totals for the 1978 appeal were \$37,808 for Adirondack, \$115,480 for Clinton, \$25,211 for Essex, \$53,548 for Franklin, \$10,516 for Hamilton-Herkimer, \$94,834 for Jefferson, \$27,598 for Lewis, and \$137,169 for St. Lawrence. In addition, \$13,149 was contributed in

special gifts made directly to the Ogdensburg office.

Matching gifts by industry will bring about \$18,000 to Wadhams Hall and \$1,000 to Mater Dei College. According to industry stipulations, these must go directly into the general operating fund of the two colleges and not into capital improvements such as the library addition.

Even though the appeal fell short of the \$150,000 requested for the Wadhams Hall library addition, Msgr. Peter R. Riani, president of Wadhams Hall, reported that construction on the \$250,000 addition is expected to begin in the spring. In addition to the \$111,000 from the Bishop's Fund, Wadhams Hall will receive about \$112,000 from alumni and friends raised in a separate appeal conducted by the seminary. This drive exceeded its goal of \$100,000.

The diocesan projects supported by the Bishop's Fund are education for priests and seminarians, the permanent diaconate program, tuition assistance to parents with children in Catholic schools, college Newman programs, the Religious Studies program at Mater Dei College, the Bishop's Charity Fund, and the departments of Religious Education, Vocations, Radio and TV, Youth, Family Life and Worship.

## Named To Oberlin Post

William A. Moffett, director of libraries at the State University College at Potsdam, has been named Azariah Smith Root director of libraries at Oberlin College, Ohio. At Oberlin he will direct one of the nation's largest college libraries. In addition to the 750,000 volume main library located in a recently completed learning center, there are also four major branch libraries for which he will be responsible.

Moffet, 48, has served as director of libraries at Potsdam since 1974 and has been chairman of the Council of Head Librarians of the State University of New York. During his tenure at Potsdam the libraries experienced significant improvements in the application of computer technology, in the development of bibliographic instruction to students and in the libraries' capacity to combat the financial effects of inflation.

A 1954 graduate of Davison College in North Carolina, Moffett received a master's and doctoral degree from Duke University. His scholarly speciality is British political history. He did advanced study in history at the University of London and in economics at the University of Nebraska. He taught at the University of Massachusetts from 1968-1974 and before that at Alma College in Michigan. His master's degree in library science is from the Simmons College School of Library Science in Boston.

7. The deserted Seaway Shopping Center now has two new businesses.

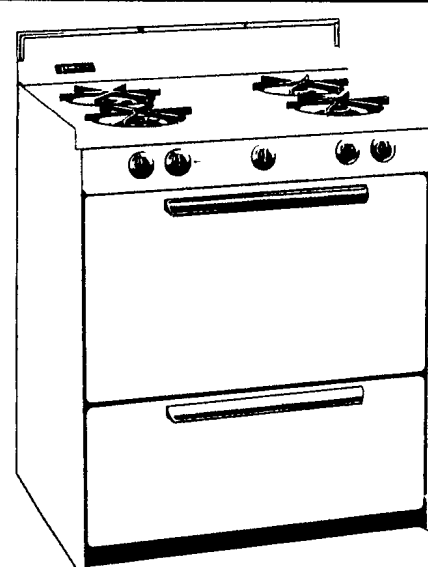
