

Tracking System Would Favor Students

MADRID — The board of education of the Madrid-Waddington Central School District has voted unanimously to change its present tracking system for English and social studies for the 1979-1980 school year.

Presently, the school offers either regents or non-regents courses in both subjects.

Under the new plan, there will be a three-section tracking system: enriched, regents, and a basic or remedial section.

Stating that over 50 percent of the student population at Madrid-Waddington is now enrolled in a non-regents track, John Dineen, high school principal, told the board last Tuesday "we are in the business of educating students not processing them."

Dineen cited many reasons for the change including: easier scheduling, and the loss of the branding of the "non-regents" classification of students.

Under the new program, Dineen stated that the student enrollment would contain approximately 20 percent in the enriched section, 60 percent in the regents section and 20 percent in the basic or remedial section.

Students tracked in the enriched or regents sections would have the option of taking the state regents examinations or the local final exams according to Dineen.

Dineen said, "We feel that a lot of kids here at Madrid-Waddington have chosen in the past to take the easier non-regents

program just to get through school. We are not challenging most of these students. With the new system, more students will have the opportunity to participate in a regents-level program."

Dineen stated that PEP tests given to all sixth grade students, Iowa tests in 7th grade, and teacher recommendations will be used in placing students in the three-track system.

Executive Post
In other action, the board voted 7 to 2 with commissioners Burton Bewick and Jennette Rucker voting no, to fund a fulltime executive office that would represent St. Lawrence County school boards and districts.

The board agreed to fund the fulltime position at a district cost not to exceed \$24,500. The board went on record stating they would fund the alternative half-time position if the majority of St. Lawrence County school boards choose that route.

Establishing a fulltime executive office is estimated to cost \$37,000 while the half-time position will cost about \$24,500.

Basically, the St. Lawrence County School Boards Association is attempting to establish an executive director position that would represent area school districts in Albany.

In addition, the local school boards would be better informed of pending legislation that would affect northern school districts.

Other Actions
In other action the board voted to

allow Mackey Tyndall to hold a wrestling tournament at Madrid-Waddington Central School on either April 28 or May 5; hired Carol Blackburn as a social studies teacher to replace William Boak; nominated board member Frank Ewing as a candidate for a five-year term on the BOCES board of education.

The board was also presented a program from William Hart, district BOCES superintendent, and members from his staff on the services BOCES offers to the Madrid-Waddington Central School District.

Hart stated that the district paid \$150,000 for BOCES services for last year with the district receiving \$100,000 in state aid; thus the district paid approximately \$50,000 for BOCES services.

Hart explained that the principle behind BOCES is for rural schools to participate in a sharing process so that students will be able to participate in as many courses as possible.

Hart stated that with declining enrollment, increasing costs, and school districts being held for greater accountability, it is essential that districts share services.
