

## Hantz Inducted Into Hall Of Fame

John Hantz, a member of the Clarkson College faculty since 1953, has been inducted into the New York State Wrestling Coaches Hall of Fame. The induction took place Saturday, February 17, at Colgate University.

Hantz, currently director of the Department of Physical Education, served the college as wrestling coach until 1968. During that period he also coached the varsity soccer and lacrosse teams.

Hantz's wrestling career began in 1937. While in college, he earned letters in wrestling and lacrosse and was honored as a member of the 1948 All-American wrestling team. In his 15-year stint as Clarkson wrestling mentor, Hantz coached two undefeated teams and earned a career record of .600. Ten of his wrestlers were conference champions and participated in state, regional and national tournaments.

## Canton ATC Is In National Tourney This Weekend

CANTON — By winning the National Junior College Athletic Association (NJCAA) Eastern Regional Tournament at Lake Placid last weekend, the Canton ATC Northmen, under Coach Terry Martin, will compete in the NJCAA national championship games March 9 and 10 at Appleton Arena, here.

As host college for the national tournament, Canton ATC will hold a banquet for the visiting college teams on March 8 at Chaney Dining Hall and will provide hosts for each team. The hosts are William Coakley and Tom Coakley for the Northeast Region representative team; Russ Harrington for the North Central representative; and Tom Coese for the Central team.

The NJCAA Tournament

The Northmen will be seeking their sixth national championship title on March 9 and 10. Last year, when ATC hosted the tournament for the first time, the Northmen won in overtime play

against Mesabi Community College of Minnesota. At 1:16 into overtime, Chris Kormanys shot the winning goal to bring the score to 7-6.

This year, Canton ATC will be playing on Friday night at 8 p.m. against the representative of the North Central Region—the region in which Mesabi plays.

Games each night will begin at 5 and 8 o'clock.

The tickets are available now, or may be purchased at the door at \$3 per adult; \$1 for students. Call 386-7127 to purchase tickets in advance.

Children under 10 will be admitted

free if they are accompanied by an adult; and Canton ATC students are to be admitted free by showing identification.

The Eastern Tournament

The winner of the regional playoffs is the representative of the NJCAA Region to the national tournament. On Friday and Saturday, Canton ATC played against Erie Community College to win the right to enter the nationals.

On Friday, the Northmen overpowered Erie by 8 to 3. Saturday, ATC again won by a score of 9-5.

Friday's game resulted in two goals by each Mark Randall, Rick Gotkin, Bob

McNair, and Jeff Fahl. Assists were by Claude Bourck with four; Sterling Bombard, two; Steve Forey, three; Clayton Watters, three; one each by McNair, Tony Carraciolo and Dave Tait.

Saturday, McNair scored four goals and had four assists; Jeff Fahl, three goals, three assists; Sterling Bombard, one goal, five assists; Tony Carraciolo, one goal; and David Sembelle, Dan Horn, Mark Randall, Rick Gotkin, and Clayton Watters, each one assist.

Jeff Fahl, who had his first hat trick in collegiate play, was voted Most Valuable Player.
