Jewish Children To Raise Money For Trees
The Potsdam Jewish community will celebrate Tu bi-Shevat, the New Year of the trees or the birthday of the trees. Tu bi-Shevat, the 15th of Shevat, is the date on the Hebrew calendar. This year it falls on Feb. 2.
Potsdam Jewish children plan to earn enough money to plant two trees, one in Potsdam and one in Israel. One tree will be planted in a Potsdam village park on Arbor Day and the other will be planted on Kibbutz Ramat Hashofet, a kibbutz located near Haifa in Israel. Rina Slutzki, the wife of Clarkson mathematics professor Giora Slutzki, is a member of the kibbutz and is also the children's teacher.
The children of the local Hebrew school will give a party from 1 to 4 p.m. Jan. 27 to celebrate Tu bi-Shevat and to raise money for the trees. The party will be at the Temple Beth-El, Market St. Mrs. Slutzki will show slides of kibbutz life and there will be movies of the life in Israel today. The public is invited. The entertainment is primarily for children, but adults are welcome. Refreshments to be sold by the children will raise the money for the trees.

Carolyn O'Dell Is Featured Performer
Traditional folk singer and guitarist Carolyn O'Dell will be featured on this week's "North Country Music" program on radio station WSLU-FM. O'Dell is a recent graduate of Potsdam State University and now resides in Wyantskill, N.Y., a small community outside of Troy.
