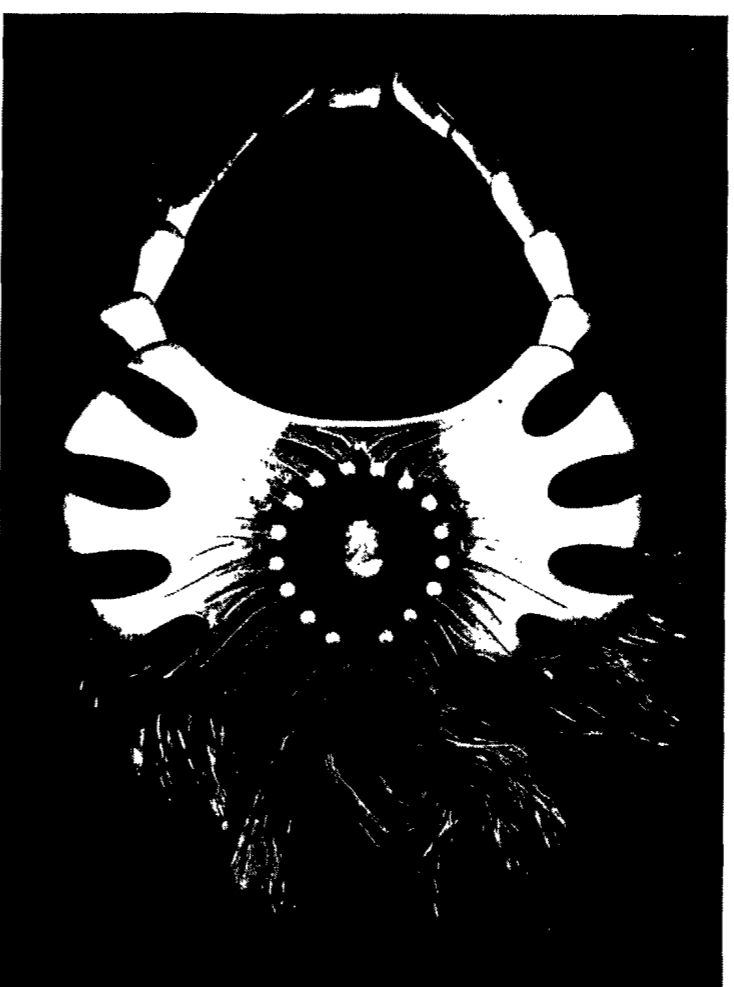

Green Is Fireman Of Year

MADRID—John U. Green, a deputy St. Lawrence County Fire coordinator and a member of the Richville Volunteer Fire Department, was named this year's recipient of the St. Lawrence County Fire Chiefs' "Fireman of the Year" award Thursday night at a dinner held here.

The announcement was made by Eugene (Pete) Crayford, Heuvelton, immediate past president of the fire chiefs' association. Lee Farrington, Norwood, president of the association, said that a committee would be formed and that the recognition dinner would be held near the end of April.

Green has been a volunteer fireman for 34 years. He graduated from Hermon High School in 1944 and shortly after joined the local fire department. He was chief of the Hermon department in 1947, 48 and 49. He is a charter member of the St. Lawrence County Fire Chiefs' Association.

In August of 1949 Green moved to Richville and joined the Richville Fire Department the following year. He went up through the ranks in that department serving as chief in 1957-58.

A member of the New York Firemen's Association, Green has been a deputy

fire coordinator since 1974. A veteran of the U.S. Army, Green is president of the Burr-Green Funeral Home, Gouverneur.

Green and his wife, Shirley Bice Green have three children, Mrs. Thomas (Martha) Storrin of Richville, and sons John V. and Thomas C.
