CANTON — The St. Lawrence County Boy Scout Council has a new council executive to succeed Stanley Mikus who resigned that position last month. County Council President John Russell said Friday morning that a selection committee, comprised of seven volunteers from the county, have chosen Laverne Gaugler of Middletown, N.Y., for the council position.

Russell said that Gaugler is presently employed by the Boy Scouts of America Greater New York City Council and will be assuming his new duties in Canton on Feb. 15.

Mr. Gaugler has served approximately 24 years in the scouting field. He has been a field service executive in Blumburg, Pa.; a district executive in Greensburg and Pittsburg, Pa.; and a director of camping in Valley Forge, Pa.

Russell said the decision to hire Gaugler was made Wednesday night by the selection committee after a series of interviews had been conducted with potential candidates for the job during the past week.

Mikus' resignation followed his arrest in Syracuse in mid-November on a charge of soliciting deviant sex. On Wednesday, that charge was dismissed "in the interest of justice," according to a spokeswoman in the Syracuse City Court.

### Thumb In Farm Mishap

MADRID — A 16-year-old boy lost his thumb in a farm accident Saturday morning when a wood-splitter was accidentally engaged.

St. Lawrence County Sheriff's Deputies said David J. Burns was working on the John Moulton farm, Rt. 1, Madrid, about 10:30 a.m. Saturday and was attempting to put a block of wood on a wood splitter.

A 10-year-old boy on the scene accidentally tripped the lever of the splitter, engaging it. The splitting wedge moved forward and severed Burns' thumb.

Deputies said Burns was taken to Potsdam hospital; the youth's thumb was packed in ice and also taken, but could not be re-attached. Burns was released from the hospital after surgery.
