State police also said that the garage had been heated with a kerosene space heater which had run out at 2 a.m.

Emerson was found in the car he was working on by his cousin Henry, 19, as he returned home from work.

Funeral services for Mr. Emerson were held Saturday, Feb. 2, 1980 at 11 a.m. at St. Mary's Church, Potsdam with Msgr. William J. Argy officiating. Burial will be in the family plot of the Bayside Cemetery.

Surviving are his father, Donald, Massena, his step-mother, Jeannie, Massena; a sister, Tina Emerson, Potsdam; his paternal grandfather, Stanley Emerson, Potsdam; several aunts and uncles.

He was born April 8, 1960 in Potsdam, son of Donald and Frances Thompson Emerson. He attended Potsdam schools and was employed as a farm worker.
