Students in grades fifth and sixth at Norwood Elementary School participated in an essay contest during fire prevention week this year. The topic for the essay was E.D.I.T.H. (Exit Drills In The Home) which each student was required to research.

Kim Colbert, a fifth-grade student in Mr. Upham's class, and Peter

LaPage, a sixth-grade student in Miss Ploof's class, wrote the winning essays. Kim's essay is as follows: "E.D.I.T.H. means exit drills in the home. You should develop a plan to get out of the house safely. You should call the family together and appoint a fire chief and an alternate, and draw a plan of the bedroom floor. Plan two escape routes out of the house, the regular route and an emergency route. You should decide upon a meeting place outside your home. If there is a fire, you should count noses when you think everyone is out. You should practice this monthly. Make sure that the emergency route is safe and easy to get out of. Check and see if the window is easy to get open; if it is large enough to get out of; and if it's the easy way to get down from your window.

Peter's Essay is as follows: "Remember if you own a woodstove you should clean it once a month. Also keep flammable liquids away from it. Always when you clean it, make sure the fire is out. At night clean up around the woodstove so the things won't catch on fire. Never add gasoline or flammable liquids to the fire. When you put in a woodstove, make sure you follow directions and install it right. Make sure you don't add too much wood to clog up the stack. Never leave the woodstove unattended. Also be careful putting in the wood. Also never paly around it so you won't get burned. Never put in flammable liquids where kids can reach them. Having a woodstove can be fun if you use it right!!!!"
