ARC Sponsors Weekend Of Handicapped Awareness

In an effort to increase congregational awareness of the handicapped, the St. Lawrence County Association for Retarded Children is sponsoring a project aimed at increasing accessibility of churches and church services to the handicapped.

The project, which has been endorsed by the Mental Retardation-Development Disabilities subcommittee of the St. Lawrence County Community Services Board, is called Access Sabbath-Sunday Weekend and will be run Nov. 13 through 15.

Among the suggestions that the ARC is making to churches and congregations is that groups from each church attend local ARC workshops and community residences for tours and classes on awareness of the handicapped; that congregations discuss ways in which church buildings can be made more architecturally accessible to non-ambulatory persons; and that churches send schedules of monthly programs to the community

residences.

Also suggested is that representatives of the local ARC speak with church groups on the changing philosophy regarding institutionalized people; that churches work with families who will take a resident of the ARC residence with them to church services; and that people from the ARC residence be directly involved with church fund-raising projects, from planning stages through completion.

Said Governor Hugh Carey in a proclamation issued earlier this year, "Persons with disabilities deserve the same access to participation, and their acceptance must be based on understanding. Our religious congregations are a most important part of our communities and play an important role in the education of the public."

The statement officially proclaimed the weekend as "Access Sabbath-Sunday Weekend in New York State."

WSLU To Hold Annual Fundraiser

CANTON—North Country Public Radio WSLU-FM/96.7 has announced that its annual fund and friend raiser will be held this year from Nov. 13-15.

WSLU is the North Country's only public radio station and each year it holds a five-day on-the-air drive to raise local support that is needed to match federal funding.

The five-day drive will focus on acquiring new members and having old members renew their subscriptions, in addition to acquiring support for three popular programs currently aired on the station: "Star Date," which gives information about what to look for in the night sky; "A Prairie Home Companion," a weekly program featuring good music and good humor for the whole family; and

"North Country Music," a program of locally performed music which currently enjoys some local business and organizational support.

The fund and friend raiser will feature many special programs and will conclude Nov. 15 with live music to be broadcast from the St. Lawrence Inn in Canton. This live extravaganza will begin at 5 p.m. and will continue until 11 p.m. or until the guest musicians grow weary. The public is invited to this program free of charge as a "thank you" from the station's staff.
