

17-Year-Old Sentenced To 10 Days

A 17-year-old Riverside Drive youth has been sentenced by Potsdam Village Justice Leon Penell to 10 days in county jail for harassment. David Laraby, 23 Riverside Dr., was arrested after police received a complaint Saturday night from his father and brother.

Several Arrests Made At Bar obituaries

NORWOOD — An investigation which was begun by Norwood Police eventually led to the arrest of four persons between Saturday night and Sunday morning.

At 11 p.m. Saturday, Norwood Police observed two young men hitchhiking on Main Street in Norwood and attempted to stop them. The two allegedly ran off, and one, identified as Dale Baxter, 17, Norwood, was followed to the Bullpen Tavern in Norwood.

Police entered the tavern and were reportedly met with resistance from the tavern owner, Lynn Lashomb. According to reports, while police were talking with Lashomb, Baxter escaped.

Police later returned to the tavern with two sheriff's deputies and found Baxter, who was arrested for disorderly conduct, failure to comply, and resisting arrest.

Lashomb, 31, 51 Mechanic St., Norwood, was arrested for disorderly conduct, obstructing governmental administration, and resisting arrest.

In the course of the investigation, Lashomb was also alleged to have been in possession of a small amount of marijuana.

He was then given the additional charge of unlawful possession of marijuana by police.

The crowd which had gathered was then ordered to disperse, police said. Also arrested were Marvin Jones, 29, Norwood, charged with disorderly conduct, and Charlotte Leigh, 31, Norfolk, charged with disorderly conduct and obstructing governmental administration. The two were patrons of the tavern, police said.

Ms. Leigh was released on an appearance ticket and Baxter, Lashomb, and Jones were arraigned before Potsdam Town Justice Shirley Harris.

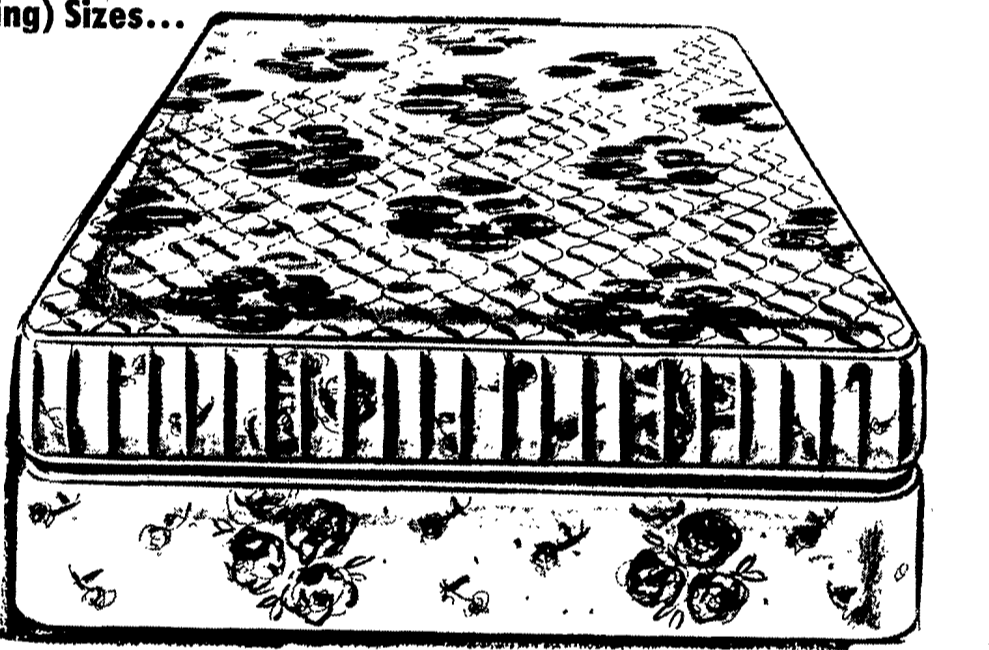
