Mr. Westdijk, the former composing room foreman for Park Newspapers of St. Lawrence Inc., died at his home at 5:30 p.m. Sunday (Nov. 8, 1981).

Mr. Westdijk was born in Rotterdam, Holland, on April 3, 1925, son of Arie and Cornelia Ham Westdijk. He attended schools in Holland and was graduated from a printer's trade school in Dagg, Holland.

During World War II, from 1945 to 1949, he served in the Dutch Army, seeing action in Europe and the Far East.

On March 19, 1953, he married Emma W. leFebore in Medan, Sumatra in Indonesia. Mr. Westdijk had been working in Indonesia as a printer.

The couple lived in Indonesia until 1955, when they returned to Holland for one year.

In 1956, they arrived in the United States with their daughter under the sponsorship of the World Council of Churches. They moved to Canton, where they have continued to reside.

Mr. Westdijk worked for the St. Lawrence Plaindealer as a typesetter and production foreman, and later, when the Plaindealer was purchased in 1969 by the Northern New York Publishing Co., he was transferred to Ogdensburg to manage the Northern New York Publishing Company's Commercial Printing Division.

In 1971 when the Commercial Printing Division closed, Mr. Westdijk joined the composing room staff of The Journal and Advance News. Later that year he succeeded Harold Mitchell as foreman when Mr. Mitchell retired. It was that year that the newspapers switched to photo offset.
