Expert On Chemicals In The Workplace To Speak

Dr. Jeanne Stellman, associate professor of environmental sciences of the School of Public Health, Columbia University and executive director of the Women's Occupational Health Resource Center, will visit the four area colleges.

Dr. Stellman, who holds a PhD in physical chemistry from City University of New York, is presently working under grants and awards from the Occupational Safety and Health Administration, the Environmental Protection Agency and the National Cancer Institute. She presently serves or has served on special committees for such diverse groups as the March of Dimes, the American Industrial Hygiene Association, the New York State Health Department Advisory Committee and the American Chemical Society.

On Nov. 16 at noon Dr. Stellman will be available in the student union lounge at Canton ATC for a brown bag lunch. There will be a brief presentation focusing on colleges and universities as workplaces, followed by time for questions and answers.

At 5:30 p.m. Monday, the Council for Women's Concerns will host an informal dinner at the Stranman at the Best Western Inn, Canton. At 8 p.m., in room 104 Clarkson Hall, Clarkson College, Dr. Stellman will give an address centering on the pro-

blems of possible worker vulnerability to the impact of chemicals and how what is and is not known about these substances can be a source of discrimination against whole classes of workers, such as women.

From 2:30-3:30 on Nov. 17, Dr. Stellman will be available in room 105
