

Composer Thomson Will Be Honored In Crane Concert

American composer Virgil Thomson will celebrate his 85th birthday with the faculty of the Crane School of Music at State University College of Arts and Science, Potsdam.

On Dec. 6, Thomson will be guest of honor at a musical tribute to his life and works presented by John Kozar, associate professor of music at Potsdam College and members of the Crane School faculty.

Kozar, a close friend of Virgil Thomson, often appears in concert with the composer. Kozar considers the concert program a personal and educational tribute to Thomson.

The program will feature a variety of instrumental and vocal works, a world premiere of a piano sonata, and scenes from "Four Saints in Three Acts", one of Thomson's two operas. Joining Kozar and Thomson will be Crane faculty members George Fourie, Robert Holland, Thomas Holliday, John Lindsey, Anita Lynch, Gordon Mathie, Lynn Meyers and guest artist Peter Wooschlager.

Students from Potsdam College's Crane School will also participate in the celebration.

Virgil Thomson was born in Kansas City, Mo. in 1896. His compositions are distinctly American with universal appeal. He has written opera, ballet, film music, symphonies and chamber music. An author and music critic for the New York Herald Tribune, have been described as "salty, witty and warm."

Pianist John Kozar recently joined the Potsdam College faculty. He received his formal musical training at Indiana University and studied in Yugoslavia. Kozar appears in concert throughout the United States, Europe and Australia.

Made possible with assistance from the New York State Council for the Arts (Meet the Composer) and the Crane Student Association, the birthday tribute will begin at 8 p.m., Sunday in Helen M. Hosmer Concert Hall.

Flute Ensemble Plans Concert

The Crane Flute Ensemble at Potsdam College will appear in public concert at 8 p.m. Nov. 22, in Sara M. Snell Music Theater.

Under the baton of its founder and director Donald Macdonald, the 12-member ensemble will perform works by Koehler, Maury, Soussman, Fisher-Tull and C. Hugo Grimm.

Macdonald, a professional concert flutist, studied at the Eastman School of Music with Joseph Mariano. In addition, he studied with the late William Kincaid, considered the dean of American flutists.

Prior to joining the Potsdam College faculty in 1961, Macdonald taught at the Eastman School of Music, the University of Texas, Trinity University and Plattsburgh High School.

He has appeared as solo flutist with the San Antonio Symphony, the Virginia State Symphony and the Buffalo Philharmonic.

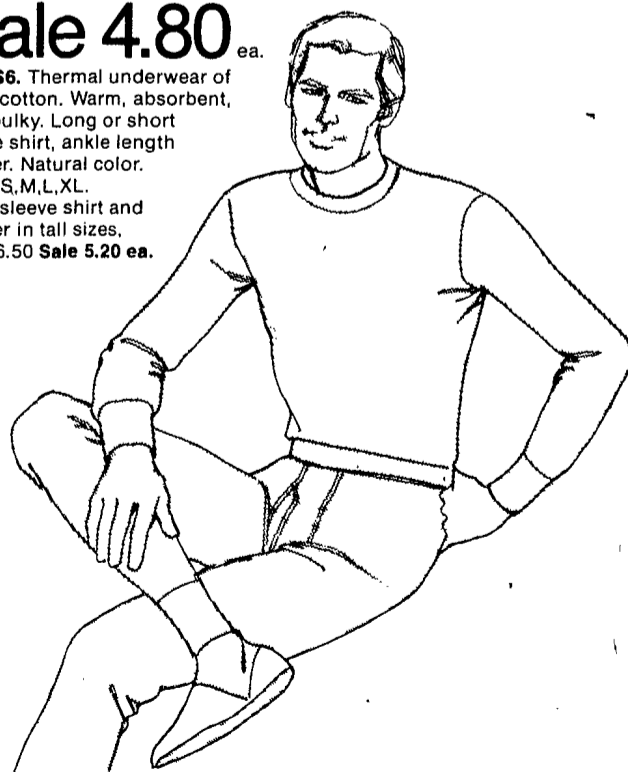
