In Potsdam Town Court Nov. 12, Judge Shirley Harris sentenced Randy Osgood, 20, Route 2, to 45 days in county jail for resisting arrest. The judge dismissed a charge of disorderly conduct against him.

Dismissals Mark Small Session In Village Court

Dismissals and conditional discharges were the order of the day Nov. 11 when Acting Village Justice Patrick VerSchneider presided over a small session of Potsdam Village Court.

The following defendants received conditional discharges on these charges:

NORWOOD — Village police here say they have a "good lead" on finding a suspected "peeping Tom" who was seen at two residences over the weekend. And they believe the incidents may be related to a number of prowler complaints that were made in the village three to four months ago, according to Police Chief James Lahey.

The most recent reports involved sightings at a Dry Bridge Road residence about midnight Friday and then at a Cemetery Road residence about an hour and a half later, Lahey said. In one case, a car and license plate number were noted by the homeowner, he added.

He said the incidents might be related to reports that were prevalent in the village some months ago involving a prowler looking into homes. The suspect was seen looking into various rooms, including a shower and bathroom, he said.

In other recent police action in Norwood, a 16-year-old from Norwood, Joann Lobello, was charged Nov. 8 with aggravated harassment in connection with a phone call allegedly made to the home of Norwood's Superintendent of Public Works and part-time police officer Dan Orth Peacock. Lahey said the caller made disparaging remarks about Peacock's character.

In a related matter, Lahey said police are still investigating a Halloween night incident at Peacock's home. They theorized that someone was scared away while making an attempt to set fire to Peacock's truck while it was parked in his driveway. Two weeks ago, police said they had some strong leads, but Lahey said that, so far, the suspects had not panned out.

In other recent police matters, Lahey said Otto G. Kuenzler, 17, Norwood, was charged Nov. 10 with trespass, in connection with a complaint lodged on Halloween.
