Firewood Lottery Being Held From County Holdings

CANTON — The St. Lawrence County Legislature, through the efforts of the county Forestry Department, will offer to sell firewood from county-owned land in 1982.

The Forestry Department manages 4,000 acres of forest land in the county and from this, 90 individual contracts will be given out for cutting. In past years, wood was sold on a first-come, first-served basis, but due to the increased demand for firewood a lottery will be used to determine the wood cutters.

A maximum of five standard cords will be sold per family at a cost of \$8 per cord. To get the wood out applicants must have a tractor, horses, oxen, etc.


Applications and information on the
