Two more points came while Barb Burkett was serving, then Franklin was back on the line to serve up the winning points, making the final 15-12.

### Flying Ns Near Repeat Of State Soccer Title Bid

**ITHACA** — Coming back from a one-goal deficit and posting of four unanswered goals, Norwood-Norfolk downed Trumansburg 4-1 Saturday afternoon at Ithaca College to repeat as the Central Conference Champions of the New York State Soccer Tournament. The win moved coach Vern Burrows' Flyers to within one game of their second straight appearance in the Class B state championship game.

Trumansburg, of the Southern Tier Athletic Conference, opened the scoring, but the Flyers struck back for the next four. N-N goalie Brian Hartin turned back the Trumansburg shots while Dan Lynch, John Sawyer, Rich McNulty and John Halverson accounted for the N-N goals.

McNulty and Sawyer assisted on Lynch's goal, with Stone picking up an assist on Sawyer's goal. Sawyer picked up his second assist of the day on McNulty's goal, and Huiatt set up for Halverson's marker.

**N-N Advances**

Tournament at Maxey Hall Nov. 20-21, had six players score double figures in the first game. Following Woods were Nick Bottini with 13 points, Scott Cuellar and Canton ATC product Gary Sparks with 11 and LeRoy Witherspoon and Jeri Mirabito with 10 apiece.

Former Norwood-Norfolk standout Greg Ferguson started and scored two points on the night while Malone's Dean Bissell added two.

Potsdam State will face Clarkson in the opening round of the Nov. 20-21 tournament with SLU and Geneseo State also in the field.

### Stoners End Dismal Season Dismally

**CANTON** — It's all over for this year's contingent of Sandstomers, who lost their last game of the season by a 28-14 mark to the Golden Bears of Canton in a game played Saturday morning. It was also second-year coach Dave Romola's last game at the Potsdam helm, as he will not return to coach the Stoners next season.

Potsdam finished the 1981 grid season in last place of the Northern Conference with a record of 0-8-1, the tie a 15-15 finish with Gouverneur. The Stoners were not able to put any points on the scoreboard until the third game of the year, when Jason Ward broke into the endzone to earn six points.

**Bears Win Second**  
Canton's Joe Conklin scrambled for 200 yards and scored on runs of 52, five and two yards to pace the Bears attack and notch their second victory of the season. Quarterback Jeff Proulx scored on a 14 yard run then passed to Mark Walcott for the conversion.

Potsdam's Brian Barney picked off a Proulx pass and ran 60 yards for the Sandstomers' first touchdown of the game. Jason Ward scored on a three yard run and scrambled in for a two-point conversion to give the Sandstomers their 14 points.

Proulx, who erased conference passing records with a brilliant senior season, converted 11 of 17 passing attempts on the day.

**Lumberjacks Blank Larries**  
Lonnie Lalonde scored twice, once in the second quarter and again in the fourth, to lead Tupper's offense in their upset win over St. Lawrence Central. Chris Fietoler threw to Sam Churo for the Jacks' first touchdown.
