Tickets Available For Bears Tourney

Tournament excitement is rapidly approaching Potsdam College. That's because the Dr. Kenneth A. Gant-Potsdam College Invitational Basketball Tournament is scheduled for Friday and Saturday, Nov. 19 and 20.

The tourney will feature archrivals Clarkson College and St. Lawrence University along with the host Bears and Augustana College, the tough Illinois team Potsdam defeated in overtime to win the 1981 NCAA Division III national championship.

St. Lawrence will face Augustana at 6:30 p.m. and Potsdam tackles Clarkson at 8:30 p.m. in first-round games Friday. Consolation and championship games are slated for 6:30 p.m. and 8:30 Saturday.

Tickets for the tournament are now on sale at Potsdam College's Maxcy Hall, the Potsdam College Union Bookstore, MVP Sports in Potsdam, Axtell's Sporting Goods in Canton, Crow's Sporting Goods in Canton, Crow's Sporting Goods and North Country Sports in Massena, and Glaude's Men's Shop in Malone.

Adult tickets cost \$5 for the tournament or \$3 per night. Student tickets are \$1 per night and Potsdam College students will be charged 50 cents per night. Tickets will also be on sale at the door on the nights of the tournament.

Season tickets are also good for the tourney. Season tickets are \$10 for adults and \$6 for students and are good for admission to all home Potsdam athletic contests. Season tickets can be purchased at Potsdam's Maxcy Hall and at the College Bookstore.

Football is back to stay in Potsdam. That's the prediction of j.v. football mentor Len Page and from the way his Junior Sandstoners looked this season, the future has to look bright for the newly revitalized high school program.

This year, Potsdam's j.v. squad finished in second place with an impressive 6-2 record. The Stoners' success was a total team effort, with the squad ranked first and third in the entire league in both defense and offense.

The Junior Stoners amassed 143 points for the season, just one point behind Massena. OFA, who went undefeated in eight games, scored 167 points.

The Stoners can also brag the stingiest defense in the league after giving up only 54 points in eight games.

Jon Mason, who rushed for over 800 yards this season, and John Jones, who also gained over 700 yards, were the mainstays of the Stoners' fine ground attack. Jones also led the squad in interceptions.

Freshman QB Chris Hewey, who has a bright future ahead of him, connected for five TD passes throughout the year.

The heart of the squad was the superb offensive line, featuring Ned Corbett, Jeff Mason, Scott Dennicourt, Mike Webster, Jeff James and Rob Wilson.

Two freshman backs, Jason Marica and Dave Krueger added depth to the offense.

Key on the defensive line were Terry Hanna and Dave Schober, who gave fits to opposing backs all year long. Rob Wilson, Steve Erdner, Ron Morrill and Butch Murray were described by Coach Page as "four of the best".

Awesome play in the linebacker slots by Fay Bard, Mark Goliber, John Jones, Mike Webster and Jeff and Jon Mason contributed to the team's success.
