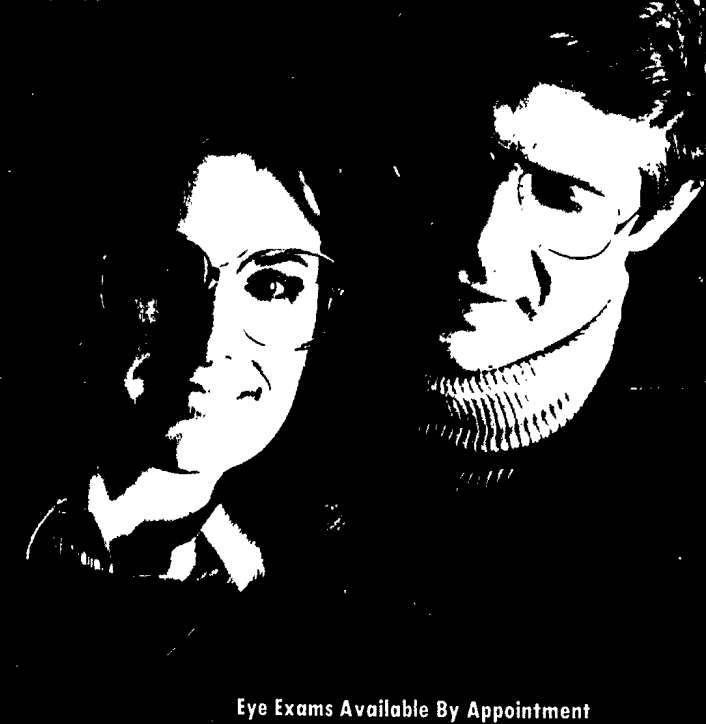
Betty Jo Jensen Weds

Norfolk Adopts \$774,070 Budget

NORFOLK — A preliminary budget of \$774,070 for 1983 was unanimously adopted by the Norfolk Town Board Nov. 15. Total appropriations and provisions for other uses are \$744,070, an increase of \$78,794 over 1982's \$665,276; estimated revenues are \$279,196 compared to \$243,577 for 1982, an increase of \$35,619; unexpended balance is \$12,800 compared to \$20,000 for 1982, a decrease of \$7,200. The amount to be raised by taxes for 1983 will be \$553,074 compared to \$401,699 for 1982, an increase of \$151,375. Justice John J. Tanski suggested that a study be made of wages of other town police departments and consider raising the salary of the Town of Norfolk Policeman, Tom Matzell, to keep him in Norfolk. In the 1983 budget Matzell's salary would be raised to \$6 an hour from the present \$5 an hour. Two appointments for the assessment board of review will be made at the Dec. 13 meeting. Louise Bixby resigned as of Nov. 8 from the Board of Assessment and Review and thanked the board for her appointment as assessor. The reversing of stop signs at the corners of Morris Street and Hutchins Street will be taken into consideration. Superintendent of Highways, Allan Baxter, will check and see if this would be feasible and he will give the board his recommendation. Upon the recommendation of Highway Superintendent Allan Baxter, the town board will purchase six mobile radios and a base station for use in the highway departments vehicles. A petition containing 13 signatures was presented to the town board making a complaint against the Fred Allen property. The building inspector will check and see if a violation exists and will report to the town board as soon as possible. This property was rezoned for commercial business in 1976. The Town of Norfolk Highway Department will plow 18.8 miles of county roads again this year. The town board has filed for financial aid for attaining compliance with building codes and fire prevention codes. The town board has applied for a Energy Audit to the New York State Department of Energy. The board has filed for a federal grant to build a fire station on Route 420. Councilman Richard Merchant is working on this project. The next regular meeting of the Norfolk Town Board will be held at 7 p.m., Dec. 13, in the Norfolk Town Hall.

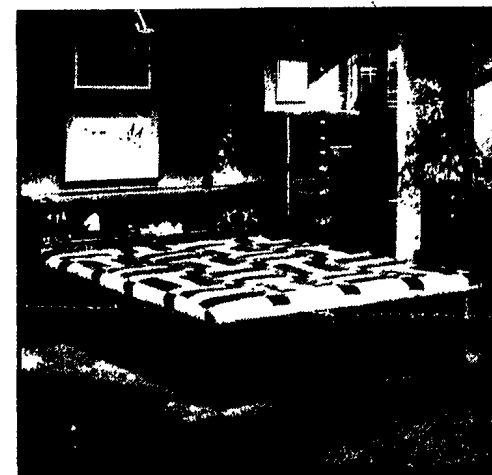

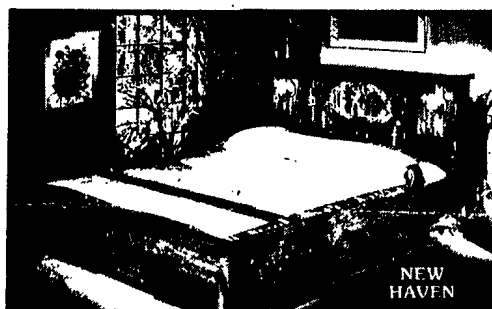

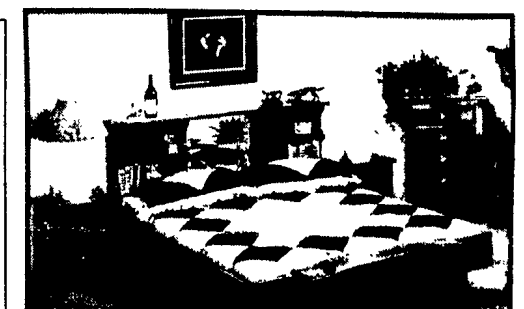
