The Norwood Volunteer Fire Department answered a mutual aid call for Racquette River on Nov. 17.

Residents living on Ashley Street, Norwood, will continue to have parking on both sides of the street. The decision was reached at the public hearing held on Nov. 15.

Mayor Willard Smith has declared Nov. 27 as Canned Foods Day in Norwood.

From 1 to 3 p.m. on that day members of the Handy Helpers 4-H Club will canvas door to door and pick up donated canned foods. The food will be used by the Neighborhood Center to fill Christmas baskets for Norwood families.

Anyone not at home when club members canvas who wishes to contribute, please drop off the food at the Norwood United Church of Christ.

The regular village board meeting was held at 7:30 p.m. Nov. 15.

Both the village board and the fire department rejected fire contracts with Norfolk for \$1 and with West Stockholm for \$250. Potsdam offered a contract \$10,000 which the fire department accepted but the village board rejected.

As of Jan. 1, 1983, if contract agreements are not reached, Norwood residents living in outlying areas will be effected. Those residing in the Town of Potsdam must call the Potsdam Fire Department; those residing in the Town of Norfolk will

call the Norfolk department and residents living in the village of Norwood and Town of Norfolk will continue to call the Norwood department. Norwood Fire Department will respond to mutual aid calls with Potsdam or Norfolk departments, to cover these areas.

Mayor Smith believes fire protection cost for village residents can be cut if the Norwood Volunteer Fire Department's primary concern is within village limits. "It is not that we want to abolish the department or interfere with fire protection. We just want our fair monetary share for

covering outlying areas," said Mayor Smith.

If residents involved would notify their respective boards asking for fair reimbursement for fire protection it might help, further explained the mayor.

Dave Flint, fire chief for the Norwood department, feels this is not feasible, will hamper fire protection in some areas and may even increase village taxes. "I just hope board members get together and solve this between themselves," said Flint.

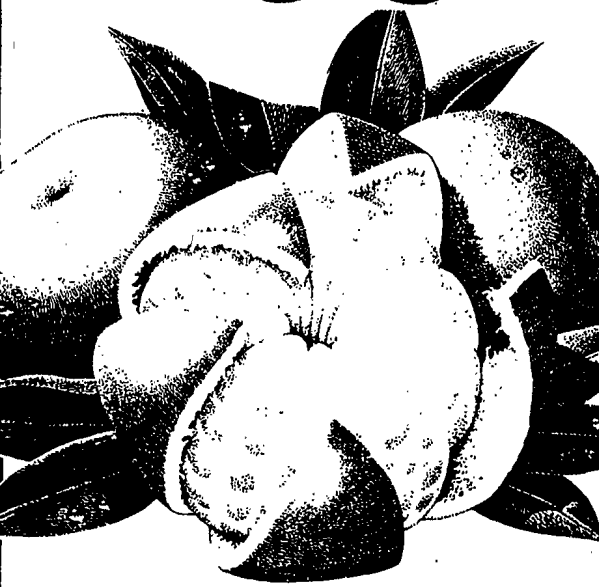
