Annual Appeal Planned

The Campaign for Human Development will conduct its annual appeal in all Catholic churches of the Diocese of Ogdensburg on Dec. 5. Established in 1970 by the National Conferences of Catholic Bishops, the campaign is the Catholic church's anti-poverty, justice-education program.

CHD funded projects enable people to work together for long range solutions to poverty in the area of legal aid, housing, health care, economic and social development and education. In the Diocese of Ogdensburg, the appeal is combined with the Indian and Negro Mission Appeal.

Since 1970, Catholics in America have contributed nearly \$100 million to CHD. One quarter of the collection is distributed to local self-help projects by the local diocese. The rest is disbursed at the national level. In the Diocese of Ogdensburg \$102,650 has been distributed to 114 different community programs from the local share. Among the programs assisted in northern New York are children's clinics, meals on wheels programs, senior citizens centers, day care centers, housing programs and many other voluntary self-help projects. In addition, three projects in northern New York have received national funding. The most recent of these is the North Country Senior Coalition which received two grants totalling \$71,000.

A \$15 fee will cover materials and dinner; all events will take place in Raymond Hall Eighth Floor, Potsdam College.

Exhibition Of Paintings Planned

An exhibition of paintings by 1981-82 grant recipients from the Creative Artists Public Service Program (CAPS) will open at the Brainerd Art Gallery at Potsdam College on Dec. 10 at 8 p.m.

CAPS, made possible with funds from Change, Inc., Chemical Bank, Consolidated Edison of New York, NBC, the National Endowment for the Arts, the New York State Council on the Arts, New York Telephone, Metropolitan Life Foundation and private donors, is the largest state-supported fellowship program in America and has awarded cash grants to creative artists since 1970.

Twenty-one artists are represented by 26 works. Although the majority of works shown utilize traditional oil on canvas as medium, Linda Lawton and Marilyn Lerner will exhibit acrylic paint and oil pastel on paper. Jim Jacobs uses lacquer on wood and Jim Hyde will display an installation floor piece.

The exhibition will remain on view at the Brainerd Art Gallery through Jan. 23. Gallery hours are: Monday, Wednesday, Friday 11 to 5; Tuesday, Thursday 1 to 3 and 7 to 9; Saturday, Sunday 1 to 5. Brainerd Art Gallery will be closed for semester break Dec. 16-Jan. 14.

'Lucia' Begins Met Broadcasts

CANTON — On Saturday afternoon, Dec. 4, the Texaco-Metropolitan Opera Radio broadcasts begins its 43rd consecutive season with Donizetti's "Lucia de Lammermoor."

Featured in the cast are Joan Sutherland in the title role; Alfredo Kraus as Edgardo; Fabio Elvira as Enrico and James Morris as Raimondo. Richard Bonynge conducts. The opera will be broadcast live, via satellite, over WSLU, 96.7-FM, North Country Public Radio at 2 p.m.

This is the first opera to be presented in the season's 20 performance series, broadcast over North Country Public Radio, WSLU-FM-96.7 every Saturday at 2 p.m.

The 43rd season of the broadcasts will contain three new productions: Verdi's "Macbeth" on Dec. 18 (last performed by the Met in 1973); the first-ever Met production of Mozart's "Idomeneo" on Jan. 15; and Strauss' "Arabella" on March 5 (last performed by the Met in 1965).

Hornist To Be Artist In Residence

Francis Orval, professional hornist, and professor of horn at the Royal Conservatory of Music at Liege, Belgium, will be artist in residence at Potsdam College's Crane School of Music Dec. 6 and Dec. 7.

Solo hornist with the National de Belgique (Brussels), Opera National (Lieu) and Radio-Tele-Luxembourg for 20 years, Orval has made six appearances with the International Horn Society, including the 1981 workshop held at Potsdam College.

In addition to a guest appearance with the Crane Horn Ensemble at 8:15 p.m. on Dec. 6 in Sara M. Snell Music Theater, Orval will present a workshop for all interested musicians at 1 p.m. Dec. 7 in Bishop Hall C 123 of the Crane School of Music complex. Included in the workshop will be reflections on styles of horn playing and survival in an orchestra.

Works From 35 Campuses To Be Exhibited

A Picasso print may be exhibited with the Lowe Collection of Wedgwood china, with European medieval manuscripts and with sculptures of Frederic Remington.

These and other works by some of the most influential contemporary artists as well as of the great masters of the past will be part of the first comprehensive exhibition of the collections of some 35 campuses of State University of New York.

And Dr. John C. Riordan, professor of art at State University College at Potsdam, has been appointed curator of this premiere exhibition.

"The permanent collections at the SUNY campuses include over 25,000 works of art and fine art artifacts," said Riordan. "We hope to provide the public with the opportunity to see for the first time, and in one place, examples of the best work from these collections."

"Selections from the Collections" is under the joint auspices of the University-wide Program in the Arts and the SUNY Council of Gallery and Exhibition Directors.

The exhibition will consist of 350-400 works of art and will reflect both the breadth and depth of the collections.

"SUNY collections offer a tremendous diversity of style, subject, media and historical emphasis," Riordan said. "They represent an immense resource of unusual educational, scholarly and cultural benefit."

Yet the SUNY art collections have never been researched, curated and exhibited for all citizens of New York State. In the process of forming this

exhibition, Riordan will research the history of the collections and their aesthetic and cultural backgrounds.

"I have already traveled to nine campuses and during the next several months, I'll visit others," he said. "We plan to publish some of my research findings as part of the exhibition catalog."

The exhibition is planned to open in February 1984 at the New York State Museum in Albany. The full show will also be displayed in New York City and Buffalo. At the conclusion of these shows, a smaller exhibit will be prepared and will travel to some 10 or 12 locations across New York and elsewhere.
