Jazz Ensemble Begins Week Of Concerts

The College Jazz Ensemble at Potsdam College's Crane School of Music will appear in public concert at 8:15 p.m. Dec. 2, in Sara M. Snell Music Theater.

Conducted by John Wilkie, the ensemble will perform works by such jazz greats as Louie Bellson, Cole Porter, Errol Garner, Rich Matteson, Stan Kenton, Sammy Nestico and Anthony Newley.

A number of members of the group will be featured in solo performance.

Visiting instructor Wilkie joined the Crane School of Music faculty this fall after a 33-year career in the Syracuse City School District where he was chairman of performing arts at Henninger High School. Under his direction the Henninger Stage Band won three international awards in jazz and the Concert Band won superior ratings at Festival of Nations' competitions. Wilkie was also director of the Syracuse All-City Symphonic Band and the All-City Stage band as well as violinist with the Syracuse Symphony. He holds the bachelor of music and the M.M.E. degrees from Syracuse University.

Dance Concert
The annual fall dance concert at Potsdam College is scheduled for Dec. 3 and Dec. 4 at 8:15 p.m. in Dunn Recital Hall.

Potsdam College faculty and students have choreographed original modern dance pieces for this public event. Sherrie Barr, assistant professor of dance, will perform a solo work of her creation, while Assistant Professor Scott Clark features a corps of dance students in his original work.

Student choreographers represented in the concert will be Susan O'Shaughnessy, Chris Makuch and Jim Meyer.

Jazz Band
The afternoon concert series at Crane School of Music will continue at 3 p.m. Dec. 4, when the student-directed Jazz Band appears in recital in Hosmer Concert Hall.

The 20-member group, under the baton of David Siegfried, will perform works by such artists as Chick Corea, Sammy Nestico, Duke Ellington and Louie Bellson.

Siegfried, a senior at the Crane School, is a strong bass performance major in the studio of Richard Stephan.

Contemporary Music
The Evening Concert Series at Crane School of Music continues at 8:15 p.m. Dec. 4, when the Crane Contemporary Music Ensemble appears in concert in Sara M. Snell Music Theater.

The program will include works by Cope, Carter, Simons, Glass and Korke as well as Cage, Cuomo, Ives, Fagiol, Smith and Steinberg.

The 25-member ensemble is directed by Dr. Paul Steinberg who joined the Potsdam College faculty in 1979.

Christmas Music
The Crane Chamber Choir will present "Music for Christmas" at 3 p.m. Dec. 5 in Dunn Recital Hall on the Potsdam College campus.

Formed in 1973, the choir is composed of 16 singers who perform chamber music from the Renaissance to that of the 20th century.

In addition to traditional Christmas carols, several works by Crane professor and composer Arthur Franckenpohl will be performed to include the premiere performance of "Carol (at a Holiday Inn on Christmas)".

This select choir is directed by Dr. Mary Lou Hultberg of the Crane faculty who holds degrees from the University of Colorado, Westminster Choir College and the University of Southern California.

Saxophone Concert
The Crane Saxophone Quartet and the Crane Saxophone Ensemble will appear in public recital at 7 p.m. Dec. 6 in Sara M. Snell Music Theater.

Under the direction of Dr. James Stoltie, the 17-member ensemble and the quartet will present music arranged or composed for saxophones to in-

clude works by Scarlatti, Pienne, Heiden, Bach, Edward MacDowell, Vogel, Lennon and McCartney and Crane professor and composer Arthur Franckenpohl.

Stoltie, who joined the Crane School of Music faculty in 1968, is director of the saxophone group. He holds degrees from Knox College (Illinois) and the University of Iowa.

Flutes, Horns
The Crane Flute Ensemble and the Crane Horn Ensemble perform at 8:15 p.m. Dec. 6 in Sara M. Snell Music Theater.

Under the baton of its founder and director Donald Macdonald, the flute ensemble will offer works by Wouters, Schieckele, Boismortier and Hirose. The Horn Ensemble, directed by Roy Schaberg, will perform pieces by

Mayer, L. Shaw and Kamarazene and will feature guest artist Francis Orval of Belgium, a professional hornist who visited Potsdam College in 1981 as a participant in an International Horn Workshop.

Macdonald, a concert flutist and Eastman School of Music alumnus, joined the Potsdam College faculty in 1961, following teaching experience at Eastman, the University of Texas and Trinity University.

Schaberg, a professional hornist, taught the University of Kentucky prior to his appointment to the Potsdam College faculty in 1968. He has studied at Oberlin College, Michigan State University and the Eastman School of Music. The public is invited to attend these concerts at no charge.
