Norfolk Woman Dies In Automobile Crash

MADRID — A 19-year-old Norfolk woman was killed Sunday night when the car in which she was riding skidded off an icy curve and crashed into an oncoming vehicle in the township of Madrid, State Police said.

Mary Alice Laramy, 19, 54 High St., Norfolk, died of injuries she suffered in the two-car collision.

The driver of the car, John Flack, 20, Ogdensburg, suffered multiple internal injuries and severe cuts to the leg. He was taken to Canton-Potsdam Hospital and later transferred to Upstate Medical Center, Syracuse, where he was listed Monday in serious condition.

Beth Bergeron, 24, 44 State St., Madrid, the driver of the second car, received minor injuries. She was treated and released from Canton-Potsdam Hospital, troopers said.

State Police said no tickets were issued, but the accident is still under investigation.
