## Brian Gardam To Direct Adolescent Pregnancy Project

Brian Gardam, Canton, has been named director of the Circle Adolescent Pregnancy Project, a program operated by Planned Parenthood of Northern New York in cooperation with North Country Children's Clinics. "Brian Gardam is uniquely qualified," Ronald Ein, Planned Parenthood executive director stated. "He brings a wealth of diverse skills and experiences to the position, and the Circle Project will benefit from his leadership." The new director will administer a project designed to assist pregnant and parent adolescents in St. Lawrence, Franklin Jefferson and Lewis counties.

Gardam was previously associated with Planned Parenthood of Northern New York as a chapter director in St. Lawrence County. In this position, he coordinated a fundraising campaign which increased chapter income, organized counseling internships through St. Lawrence University, and developed a project to involve males in family planning.

Born in Kingston, Ont., Gardam was raised in upstate New York communities where his father served as a minister. Since receiving a bachelor's

degree from Syracuse University, he has completed postgraduate courses in grantmanship, supervision and management, and is registered to begin a master's program in health services administration.

### Mini-Series Will Be Funded Through Grant

CANTON — North Country Public Radio, WSLU-FM/96.7, received notification that it has been awarded a grant for \$1,300 from the New York Council for the Humanities for the production of a five-part radio mini-series entitled, "Ray Fadden: A Native American Perspective on the Iroquois Confederacy."

The series, to be produced by WSLU's Production/Operations Manager Louis Cook, will focus on the historical and cultural lectures of Native American historian Ray Fadden. Fadden established the Six Nations Museum in Onchicola, N.Y. over

25 years ago and has been its director since.

The five programs planned for the series are: "The History of the Iroquois," "The Iroquois Confederacy," "The Contributions of Native Peoples to Modern Civilization," "The History of the Continent and Conservation: A Native Point of View," and "Children's Lessons Stories."

Dr. Robert Wells, Chairman of the Department of Government at Lawrence University will serve as humanities advisor and commentator for the project.
