Officials Want Hearing On Charges Of 'Sloppy' Handling

CANTON — St. Lawrence County Community Development Program officials want a public hearing to refute charges made against their agency by the county Social Services Department that CDP did a poor job of handling the county's heating assistance program.

CDP President J. Albert Wright said the allegations made by the Social Services Department "raise serious questions about CDP's capability to conduct programs serving the poor."

But after he heard the allegations made last Monday, Wright said, he examined the records of the HEAP program and found that "the allegations made by the department of Social Services officials are inaccurate."

In a letter to the legislators who serve on the Social Services Committee, board members of CDP, CDP officials and others, Wright has formally requested the committee hold a public hearing to get to the truth about the allegations.

Wright said he wants Social Services Committee Chairman Lloyd Moore to convene the hearing to "establish the facts about CDP's conduct of the program, to permit CDP to respond to the allegations about its poor performance, and to present information about CDP's capability to operate effective programs serving

the low-income citizens of St. Lawrence County."

"Because there is little time left before the expected start of the 1983 HEAP program, I urge you to call this hearing as soon as possible," Wright said in a letter to Moore.

The Facts

In a separate letter to CDP staff members, Neighborhood Center Directors, and Head Start Center Directors, Wright has told them the hearing has been requested to give CDP "a chance to present the facts and set the record straight."

Last Monday, CDP officials met with Social Services staff members and legislators on the Social Services Committee to ask that they receive an increase from \$7 to \$12 per application for CDP to run the program.

Last year, CDP processed more than 1,300 applications for county residents who were under the age of 60, who were not on public assistance, but met income eligibility guidelines to receive assistance to pay for heating fuel.

But instead of negotiating over a \$5 per application increase requested, Social Services Social Services officials told legislators that CDP caused delays that lasted months, and did a sloppy job handling the applications
