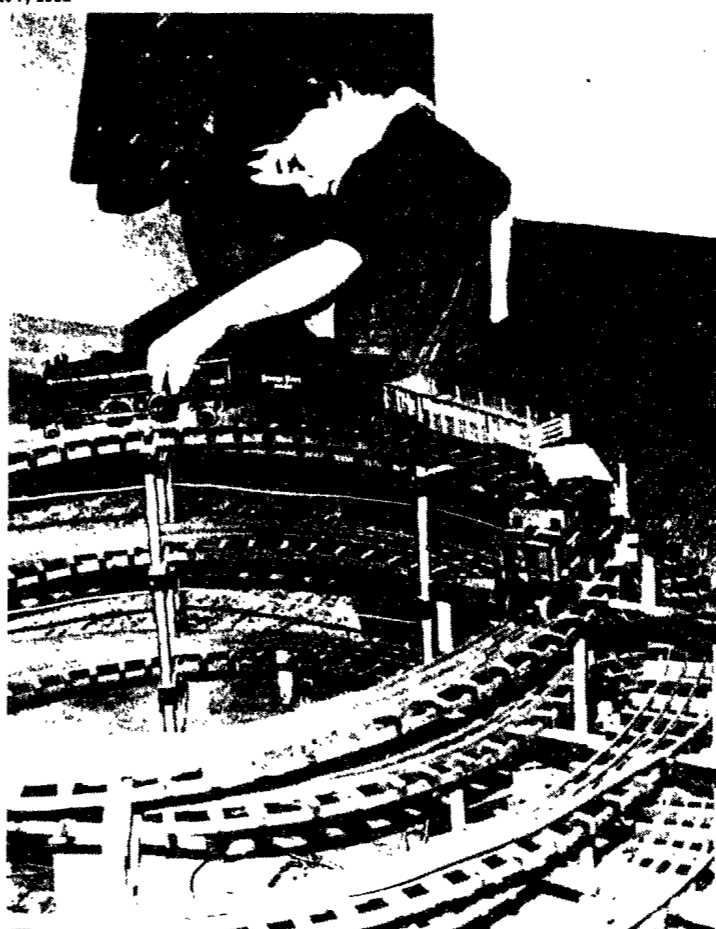

The Northern New York Chapter of the National Multiple Sclerosis Society has announced that Dr. Massoud Azar, a neurologist from Plattsburgh, with a special interest in multiple sclerosis, will give a lecture describing the disease and current research efforts.

The gathering will be held in Canton at the United Helpers Canton Nursing Home, formerly Moongate Nursing Home, at 7:30 p.m. and is open to all MS patients, families, friends and to the general public.

The Society has also announced that a Patient Services Committee has been formed to assist the patients of St. Lawrence and Franklin counties in meeting their various special needs. The committee members are Margie van Lent, Anne Huntington, Mary Schlegel and Dr. Mary Swaykus from DeKalb Jct., Pat Trombley, Arnold Hills, Mark Brackett, Herbert Bullock, Lyn and David Holmes and Sara Ort from Canton; Susan Smith from Potsdam, and Father Lawrence Jones from Norwood.

## Head Start Expands Services

Head Start, a highly successful and long running program sponsored by the federal government, has expanded its operation in St. Lawrence County by 35 children. With this expansion, Head Start now serves 191 preschoolers and their families.

Head Start, implemented in 1965, is a broad and comprehensive program providing educational, health and social services to low income children and children with handicapping conditions. What makes it different from other pre-school programs is its emphasis on parent involvement and participation in all aspects of the program.

In St. Lawrence County, Head Start involves two different approaches to its program: centers, where the children come into the program four days a week, and home base, where the visitors go into the children's homes. In Ogdensburg, the existing center has enlarged its program to include 15 more children. Home base has expanded to create new programs in Canton and Norwood-Norfolk, serving an additional 20 pre-schoolers and their families.

To meet the needs of this expansion, four new staff members have joined Head Start. Nan Lazovik is the new teacher at the Ogdensburg center, and Mary Belile, a past parent, is the teacher assistant. Barbara Adams, former Head Start parent and program volunteer, has been hired as home base visitor in the Parishville-Colton area, replacing Sarah Manley

who is now working in the expansion program in Norwood-Norfolk. Susan Avery is the new home base visitor in the Canton expansion program.

These expansion programs enable Head Start to increase their efforts to strengthen the understanding and ability of parents to support their child's education now and after the child enters school.

## Library Open House Set

**HOPKINTON** — The Hopkinton Town Library will hold an open house from 2 to 8 p.m. Dec. 13 at the town hall. Refreshments will be served.

At this time there will be a display of works done by the adult art classes sponsored by the library. These classes have been held intermittently throughout the year in four six-week sessions.
