Happy birthday to all born in December.

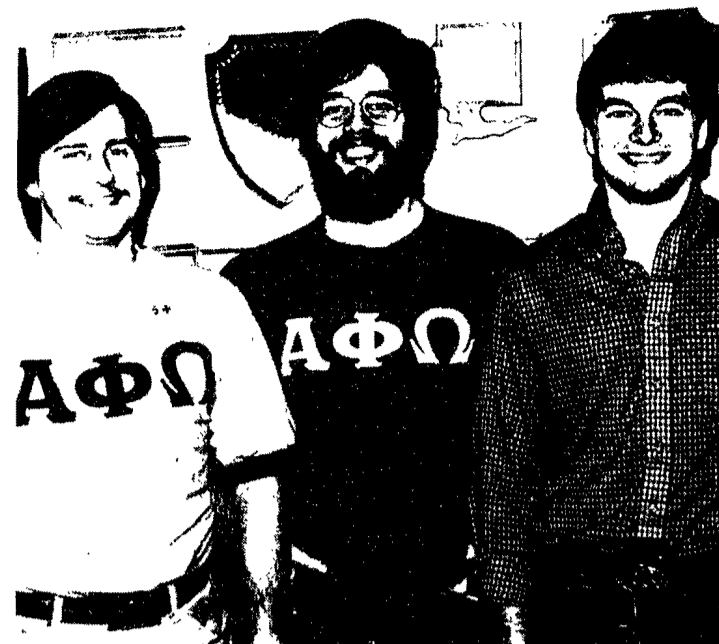
