Police Investigate Three Accidents, Charges Filed

State police in Canton investigated three accidents Friday. Two of the accidents were two-car collisions in which at least one vehicle was traveling in the wrong lane. The third was a one-car accident in which the driver fell asleep and drove off the road.

At 2:30 p.m. Friday, police said, on Rt. 56 in the Town of Potsdam about seven-tenths of a mile north of the Unionville Road, a car driven by Jeffrey A. Gerrish, 19, of Potsdam, was southbound in the northbound lane when an oncoming car driven by Charles A. Gardner, 23, of Malone, swerved into the opposite lane to avoid a collision.

At this point, troopers said, Gerrish swerved back into his own lane, resulting in a head-on collision between his car and the Gardner vehicle. Gerrish, police said, was charged with failure to keep right.

Gerrish suffered a possible fracture to his left hand, police said, plus lacerations to his scalp and multiple contusions and abrasions, and was transported to the Canton-Potsdam Hospital.

Driver Charged

Scott R. Davis, 19, of Potsdam, was charged with driving while intoxicated after the car he was driving, which was traveling north in the southbound lane on Rt. 56 in the Town of Potsdam Friday night, struck a southbound car that was attempting to turn right onto a dirt road, police said.

The second vehicle, troopers said, was driven by John S. Soucis of Colton.

One-Car Accident

The driver and a passenger were treated and released at the Canton-Potsdam Hospital Friday following a one-car accident in which the driver claimed he fell asleep at the wheel, state police said.

Police said James E. Lebo, 18, of Brasher Falls, was charged with failure to keep right after he apparently fell asleep and drove off the left side of the road on Rt. 56 in the Town of Colton about two and a half miles south of the Joe Indian Road.

After leaving the road, police said, the car came to rest when it struck a large balsam tree.

Lebo and a passenger, Chris L. Compeau, 17, of Winthrop, suffered cuts and bruises and were released following treatment at the Canton-Potsdam Hospital.

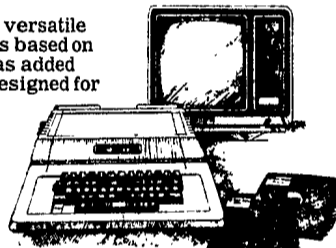
