Heating Aid Offered To Elderly Through Office For Aging

The St. Lawrence County Office for the Aging will again participate in the Home Energy Assistance Program (HEAP), according to Office for the Aging director Joseph Sears. Final approval of the New York State Plan by the federal government will determine the exact starting date and this year's requirements and guidelines for the program.

As in the past several years, the Department of Social Services will be the lead agency in this county and will be responsible for payment to all recipients as well as certification and outreach to public assistance recipients and all non-public assistance recipients under age 60. This outreach will be provided either by contract or directly by this department.

The task of providing certification and outreach to all senior citizens of the county will be the responsibility of the Office for the Aging. This office has decided to provide initial outreach through the use of a mail-in application which is available for use by senior citizens. No senior citizen in St. Lawrence County will have to travel to any location to sign up for this year's fuel program, according to Sears.

He was also a senior resident at Mercy Hospital in Buffalo and is board certified in ear, nose, and throat surgery by the Royal College of Surgeons. He has practiced in St. Lawrence County since 1968.

It is illegal to slide on the ice on the sidewalks of Wilmington, Delaware. On purpose, anyway.

The Fourth Amendment guarantees freedom from unnecessary searches, and generally by a search warrant is needed before an authority can investigate. However the U.S. Supreme Court has ruled that police who have a reasonable cause may search a vehicle for contraband without a warrant.

The DEFENDANT is the party sued in an action, the person a complaint is filed against. The suit is brought by the PLAINTIFF.

Punitive Damages will often be paid by the defendant who has done something so wrong that the judge or jury feels he must be punished monetarily. Punitive Damages are assessed over and above the plaintiff's actual damages.
