Last week was quite a week. I thought the Village of Potsdam should give serious consideration to planting a string of palm trees to go with the other trees that have been planted in recent years on the village streets. I further gave thought to the idea that I could put coffee trees in my garden. The coffee plants would go well with all of the traditional plants that I grow in the summer. The skiing was about as funny. Whiteface had to close down its several trails that were open before the heat hit the slopes. The warm weather is expected to abate this week. The National Weather Service issued its long-range forecast for the winter this past week. The forecast calls for above normal temperatures and normal precipitation for the winter. Weather experts seem to think that the subtropical jet stream flowing out of Mexico will continue to move northeastward to the northeastern United States and the maritime provinces of Canada. This unusual jet stream which has brought the above normal temperatures over our part of the country will undoubtedly end some time this winter.

There is no way to tell when the jet stream will return to normal and the winds will blow out of Canada again. It is just that a good part of the winter is expected to go by before this correction of the winds aloft in the jet stream occurs. As long as these winds, which

a base in excess of 150 inches. The big storm of December 1 covered most of the Utah and Colorado areas with about two to four feet of snow. This is obviously the year to ski out west. Airplane warfare has made the trip from Boston to Denver only \$225 a round trip the last time that I checked it. Even the new snowmaking in the east will not resolve the problem because the warm air aloft makes it impossible to make snow because it is not cold enough to do so.

Right now there is not too much to worry about; it is still early in the season. If the warm air keeps flowing like it has been right up until Christmas, there could be a financial disaster for the ski country. We will just have to see if we get another "open winter."
