Wins SLU Fiction Prize

CANTON — "Home Fires," a collection of short stories by David Long, has won the 1983 St. Lawrence Award for Fiction. The prize-winning book was published by the University of Illinois Press.

Long's stories have appeared in such journals as "Sewanee Review," "Denver Quarterly," "Carolina Quarterly," and "Fiction International." 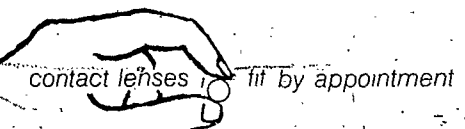
