Tupper Lake, retiring in 1962.

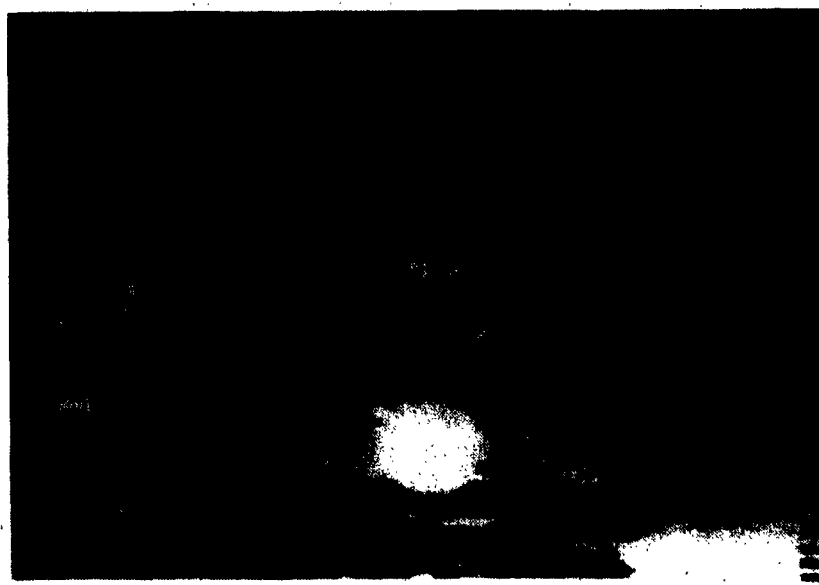
Burr Kingsley, Old Market Road, Norfolk, observed his 85th birthday Jan. 8.

Kenneth Stickney, Brookdale, who has been a patient in the Saranac Lake General Hospital since Dec. 23 has returned home.



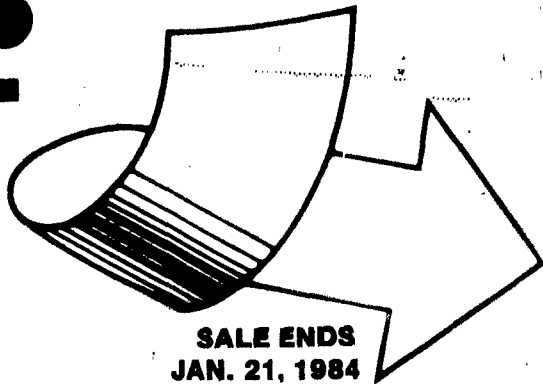

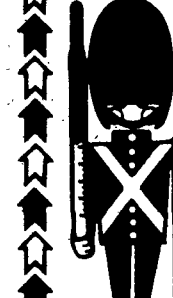
