

Section Agrees, Director Sought

Many details have yet to be ironed out, but a full-time director for the Northern Athletic Conference Section 10 will be hired through BOCES, the section's board agreed Wednesday in Canton.

An agreement was reached by school district representatives on a financing plan, but now such things as appointing a search committee and advertising for the position remain before the actual process of interviewing candidates begins.

District representatives agreed on a financing plan based half on enrollment and half on a fixed fee plus additional cost per sport.

The coordinator will have to be highly qualified, said Norman E. Whyte, vice president of Section 10 and principal of Colton-Pierrepoint Central School. "He'll have to have a professional degree, probably in physical education or recreation, because he'll be teaching mandatory coaching classes."

Whyte added that the section has nobody in mind for the \$20,000 per year job. "It's wide open," he said.

Each local district will have to apply to BOCES for their share of state aid, said Whyte. The aid is finally available this year because of a new interpretation of the law regarding BOCES-aidable items.

The creation of the position has been sought for years because of increased time and paperwork involved in getting on so much of applicants to handle effectively.

A target date of July 1 has been set to hire the director for the Northern Athletic Conference, which covers about six counties and 30 school districts.

Hospital, Clerical Workers Agree

Canton-Potsdam Hospital and Local 200 SEIU have agreed to a one-year contract covering approximately 50 clerical workers. Employees ratified the contract on last Wednesday, and the hospital is expected to officially ratify the pact in the next few days. The contract is the first between the union and the hospital.

Under the agreement, employees will be placed on a wage scale, with minimums and maximums for each job grade equal to the hospital's existing levels for non-union employees. In addition, employees not at top of scale will move to their next step, approximately three percent, on completion of each year of employment.

Benefits will remain essentially unchanged. One significant change will be that clerical employees hired after Nov. 1, 1964, will pay 50 percent of any increase in individual health insurance premiums.

Whiteface Trails Improved

This appears to be a good year so far for Whiteface Mountain. The big Adirondack ski area has long been criticized for lacking certain things. Now many of those needs have been met.

The main complaint about Whiteface Mountain in years gone by has been the ice and the lack of snow. Normally, the upper mountain and the number six chair was not open. Finally there were complaints about the poor uphill lift capacity of the lifts, and the number of skiers per hour that could be carried up the mountain was quite low for a major destination resort ski area.

All of these complaints have now ceased. The 1960 Olympics brought Whiteface out of the dark ages. Installed were four new lifts replacing the old ones with the poor uphill lift capacity. Modern snowmaking methods installed to replace the old ineffective system made a lot of terrain skiable that was previously not possible.

The Lake Placid Olympics led to the establishment of many other facilities like the 70 and 90-meter jumps. These facilities in turn needed to be managed after the games, and this fact led to the founding of the ORDA, or the Olympic Regional Development Authority, an entity separate from

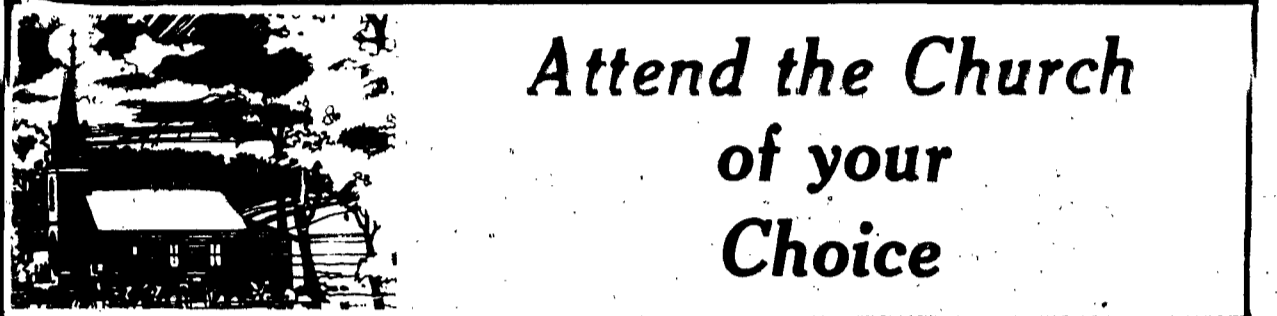
