

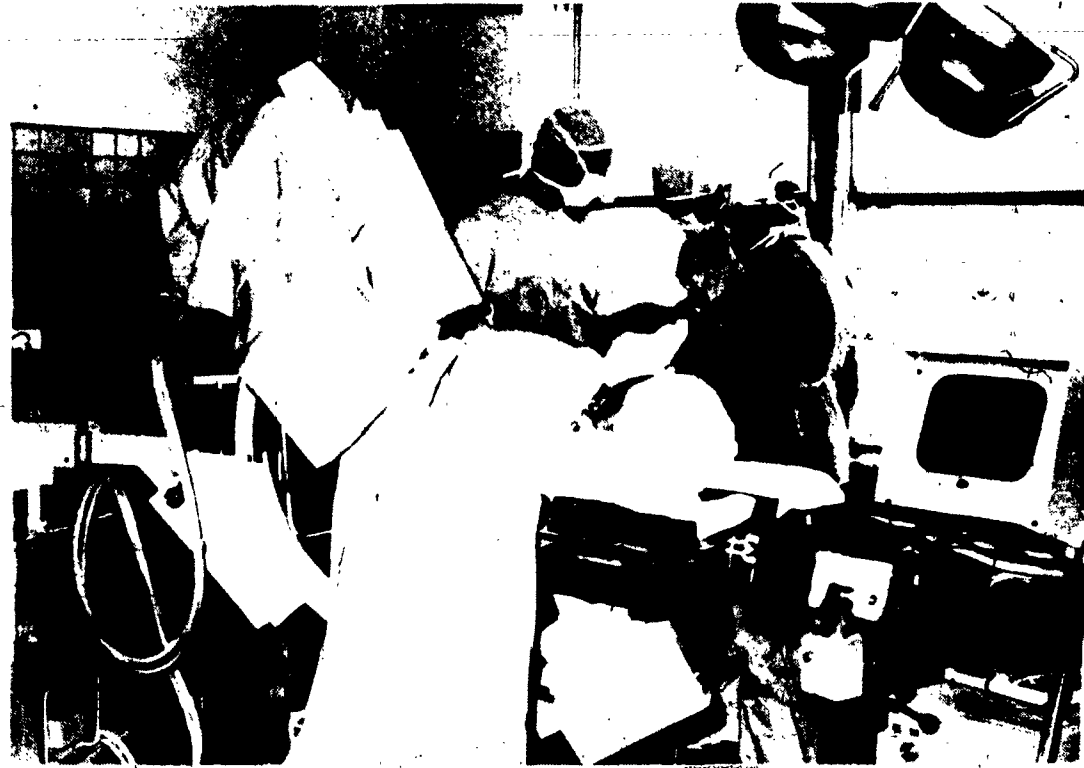
# A. Barton Hepburn Hospital
