

Bear Skaters Look For Consistency

It's been like an elevator ride for the 6-7 Potsdam College men's hockey team so far in this 1984-85 season.

Slowed by an incredible rash of injuries and a lack of collegiate experience, Coach John Horan's crew has struggled at times this year, but still is within striking range of a playoff appearance in March.

Most of the important games played in the first half of the year were on the road, so Horan is optimistic that smoother roads lie ahead.

He attributes the inconsistent play to the youthful blend of talent which was thrust into the starting lineup due to injuries to key veterans, such as superstars Brian Bell, Stephan Laperriere, and Ted Bach.

"I'm disappointed with our inconsistency, but if the top players are not able to play, you have to be realistic in your view," said Horan.

It was the injuries to Bell and Laperriere that hurt the squad the most.

Bell, last year's ECAC Division II Player of the Year, nursed a shoulder injury for the past month. Although he only missed two games, he was not 100 percent for four others. In the two he missed, the Bears lost to Brockport and Plattsburgh.

Laperriere, one of the league's outstanding netminders, has missed important games against RIT,

Hobart, and Ottawa. Bach, a tri-captain with Bell and Dave Palmisano, missed key contests with Elmira, Buffalo, and Canisius.

Horan has been excited by the development of many of his freshman skaters. He feels defenseman Howie Vandermast "is going to be one of the very best before he's through. He's a top-notch defender."

Luc Boileau, Tim Kelley, and Maurice Gionet have scored big goals for Potsdam, picking up the slack left by Bell and Bach's absences.

One of the tri-captains, Palmisano, has excelled, from his defense position, in all aspects of play this year. A prime candidate for All-America, Palmisano is second on the team in scoring, behind team-leader Bell, with 20 points, one of the highest totals for blueliners in the Division II circuit.

"Dave Palmisano has had the most direct effect in any success we've had this year," said Horan. "Not only has he increased his scoring dramatically, he's been on the ice for an average of 40 minutes a game. He's on the ice when we're

shorthanded and when we're in a powerplay situation."

"In my opinion, he is the best defensive player in Division II," boasted Horan.

Not wanting to harp on the difficult injury situation, which at times left practice in a shambles, Horan praised his team's character.

"We have a lot of potential here with the young players on the team. We've got to put the first semester behind us. We must prove, in the second half, that we are the playoff caliber team I think we are."

Noting that most of the tougher games against the national powers will be at home in friendly Maxcy, Horan is optimistic he and his sextet will find reason to smile.

His first objective over Christmas break is to get everyone healthy again. However, the goalie situation will still be perilous, because Laperriere is not expected back in time for the Merrimack Tourney Jan. 5 and 6 in North Andover, Mass.

If all the pieces fall together in the second half, playoff fever will once again strike the Potsdam hockey world.

Free Booklet Offered For Senior Citizens

Assemblyman John G.A. O'Neil (R-Parishville) announced recently that the Public Service Commission (PSC) has published a free booklet which outlines various PSC programs, services, regulations, and protections for senior citizens who are utility customers.

O'Neil explained the free booklet, "PSC Programs and Protections for Senior Citizens," includes information on steps to follow when a utility problem has not been satisfactorily resolved; useful do-it-yourself information such as how to cut energy costs; how to check electric usage; and the types of heating and energy assistance programs available from various state agencies.

"Many senior citizens do not realize that there are specific programs and laws to protect and help them understand and pay for their utility services, for example, senior citizens living on a fixed income may require a utility to adjust their monthly billing date until after they receive their benefit checks to help avoid late payment," he said.
