

Stoner Girls Continue Losing Skein

Gouverneur raced to a commanding 36-12 halftime lead en route to a resounding 52-26 win at Potsdam last night in NAC girls basketball action.

It was Potsdam's fourth consecutive loss of the year. The Stoners hope to find their first 1985 win at home Thursday, against Norwood-Norfolk.

Mary Jo Fields had another strong inside game, scoring 12 points and gathering a flock of defensive rebounds. Margaret Gibbs was outstanding running the offense, and she also scored eight points. Kelly Norman, Potsdam's fine sophomore guard, was held to two points by the Wildcats.

Patty Bush led the way for Gouverneur, scoring 16, while teammate Wendy Macturk flipped in ten. Potsdam was forced to play the game without two starters, Monica Converse and Kathy Bradley, both out indefinitely with injuries.

Potsdam's JV squad had similar difficulties, losing 35-15 to the Wildcats. Lori Langtry scored 11 for Gouverneur, while Marcy Matoti's four markers sparked Potsdam's losing cause. The JV squad, coached by Hal Gillette, is now 1-3.

Bears Hold On
The Stoners, trailing 30-22 to start to fourth quarter, rallied to within one, 30-29, before running out of gas losing at Cantor 35-26.

The game was close throughout, with neither team establishing a consistent offensive pattern. Sarah Spencer was the big gun for the Stoners, scoring 11 points. Norman contributed eight, Fields, and Bradley each added four.

Potsdam trailed at the first quarter stop, 12-10, but pulled even, 18-18 at the half. Cantor, led by Cindy Rabideau and Marsha Evans, held a 28-22 edge after three.

Rabideau, a pint-sized point guard, had an off-night shooting, finishing with nine points. Evans scored eight, mostly on strong drives to the hoop. Karen Furgal and Jodi Axtell contributed to the balanced attack with seven and six points each.

The JV team also found trouble at Cantor, falling 40-20. At one point, the scrappy JV's pulled to within six, but a strong fourth quarter by the Bears clinched the easy win. Kate Baker led the Potsdam squad with six points, all in the first three minutes of the third quarter when the Stoners made their move.

Fretz Stars In Europe

Clarkson All-American defenseman Dave Fretz took a week away from the Golden Knights hockey schedule recently to participate in an international tournament in Davos, Switzerland.

While Fretz' teammates were playing in the Syracuse Invitational Tournament, the senior was skating with Team Canada in the Spengler Cup Tournament from Dec. 26-31.

Fretz, the only United States college player on the Canadian roster, was named to the All-Star team as Canada won the tournament for the first time in the 58-year history of the Cup. Other countries represented in the tourney were teams from the Soviet Union, West Germany, Czechoslovakia, and Switzerland.

Grapplers Scare Brockport

The Potsdam College wrestling team had one of their most impressive showings in several years last weekend, thumping RIT and losing to powerful Brockport in a tight battle.

In the 28-15 loss to the Golden Eagles, Jan. 12, 190-pound Terry Burnat, 129-pounder Brent Griffin, and Rick Bart, a 118-pound freshman, were big winners for the Bears against the nation's top Division III wrestling program.

Bart, in only his second collegiate match, edged Bob Dreidenstine 8-7 to give Potsdam a quick lead. Then Griffin went to work, pinning his opponent in a snappy 1:06. Brockport stormed back, winning the next five matches, two by technical fall.

Potsdam's Mike Price at 167, lost a controversial 7-6 decision to Eagle All-American Todd Slade. Burnat, the captain and star of the Bears, was the only other Potsdam victor, defeating Dennis Leonard by a technical fall.

The afternoon before saw a fine all-around performance by Neil Johnson's bunch lead to a resounding 27-15 win at RIT.

Once again, Bart started strong, pounding Scott Burke 10-4 at 118. The next Bear win was at 142 where Duane Averill won by

technical fall over Kevin Sampson. Mario Fiacco picked up a win at 160, edging Parker Ward 12-8.

Potsdam's Price pinned Tiger Dan Allen in 5:58, Mike Martin squeaked past Jim Leamon 3-2, and Burnat slammed Todd Morris with a pin at 12:21.

The Bears are now 2-4 overall, 0-3 in the tough SUNYAC competition. They wrestle in the New York State Championships Jan. 18 and 19 in Ithaca.

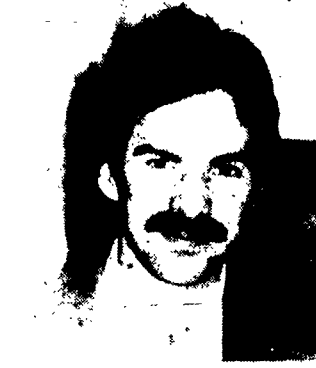
