Hospital Guild Plans For Antique Show

The executive board of the Potsdam Hospital Guild met on Jan. 3 to formalize plans for its 22nd annual antique show and sale to be held at Clarkson's Walker Arena May 4. A revised floor plan will accommodate 37 antique dealers and will give more space to the refreshment area, making it more easily accessible to the public and workers. Admission to the show will be \$1.50 with a discount to senior citizens.
