When Dahl and Alta McCormick went to Watertown last weekend, it took them 90 minutes to return from Watertown to Gouverneur.

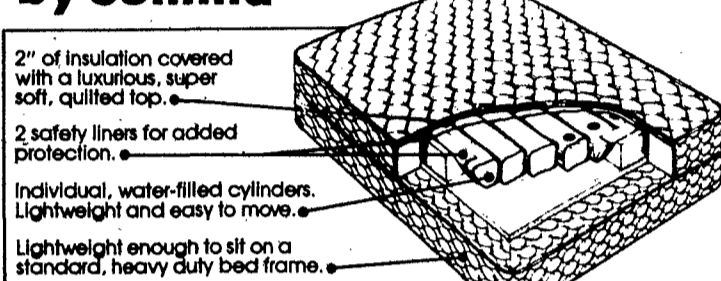
