Sea Grant Director Resigns

Stephen D. Brown, who has been the director of the St. Lawrence River Sea Grant Extension Program for the past 10 years, has been appointed as a community and rural development/small business specialist for the University of Vermont's Extension Service in St. Johnsbury. Brown starts his new position in March.

Ten years ago, Brown opened the St. Lawrence River office at Potsdam College and during his tenure coordinator research and extension projects in tourism, small business management, St. Lawrence River issues such as oil spills and winter navigation, and river management.

A member of the sea Grant Extension Program since 1974, Brown holds an M.B.A. from Clarkson University and an M.S. in Park and Recreation Resources from Michigan State University.

Prior to working for Sea Grant, Brown worked for Planning Associates — Education and Recreation Consultants and for the Park and Recreation Resource Research and Planning Unit.
