

## P-H Introduces New Teachers

PARISHVILLE — As the second semester is about to begin at the Parishville-Hopkinton Central School, the school board has announced several new faculty members.

Glenn Clark will be teaching in the school's outdoor education program. He replaces Kathy Hentcy who will be returning to the Albany area. Clark is a 1981 graduate of SUNY at Oswego where he received a B.A. in zoology. Following graduation, he spent time training at the National Outdoor Leadership School in Lander, Wyo. A holder of teaching certifications in biology, chemistry and general science, Clark is currently enrolled at SUNY Plattsburgh in the masters degree program majoring in education and outdoor education.

Clark has taught on a long-term replacement basis in high school science at the Brushton-Moira Central School and spent one year teaching at St. Agnes Catholic School in Lake Placid. At St. Agnes, he taught junior high math, science, physical education, computers and coached the elementary basketball team.

Clark has also spent a significant amount of time in the High Peaks Wilderness Area as a park ranger, wilderness ranger and trail maintenance technician. Additionally, he spent time at the Rice Creek Biological Field Station in Oswego as a student curator and lab assistant. His interests lie in the outdoors where he enjoys backpacking, cross-country skiing, hiking and fishing. He is an Eagle Scout.

Mary Lane is a 1982 graduate of Mansfield State College in Mansfield, Pa. At Mansfield, she participated in the Special Olympics, the Social Work Club, a Big Sister Program and was a Resident Assistant. She received a B.S. in secondary education, majoring in social studies. A dean's list student, she was nominated for "Who's Who in American Colleges."

Lane's teaching experience includes teaching eighth grade social studies during the summer school session at Massena Central, a half-year replacement position in high school social studies at Franklin Academy in Malone, as well as a replacement position at Potsdam Central, also in high school social studies.

Lane has travelled throughout the United States and her interests include swimming and helping others. She is a former AFS exchange student and will be active with the high school students in their extra-curricular activities. Lane will be filling the recently added position of social studies/English teacher to better provide a valuable educational experience for the high school students.

Timothy Muehl will be teaching high school biology/earth science and will be replacing David Parisian who is returning to school to

complete his graduate's work. Muehl is a 1980 graduate of SUNY at Oneonta where he majored in secondary education/biology. He is a New York State certified science teacher working on his masters degree in biology at Potsdam College.

After graduating from Oneonta, Muehl spent four years teaching at St. Dunstan's Episcopal School in Christiansted, St. Croix, USVI. At St. Dunstan's, he taught junior high earth science, life science and senior high biology, advanced placement biology, marine biology, physics and chemistry. He has been an advisor on energy exhibition projects displayed during National Energy Education Day on St. Croix.

He is a former National Honor Society student who did his student teaching in the Cobleskill area. His interests include running, swimming, skin diving, backpacking, photography and other sports. During the upcoming summer months, Muehl will be working with Dr. Donald Osterburg at Potsdam on the St. Lawrence Seaway Project.

Denise Murray will be the school's newest math teacher. She will be assigned to seven through ten math as well as working with several beginning groups on the microcomputer. Raised in Morristown, Murray is a 1982 graduate of Plattsburgh State University where she majored in mathematics education. She has participated in some long-term substitute teacher work at Ogdensburg High School, Heuvelton Central School and, most recently, completed a half-year replacement position at Hammond Central School.

During 1984, Murray taught college algebra at Mater Dei College in Ogdensburg. She is a certified elementary and secondary education teacher, specializing in math. She is a past recipient of the Lions Club Merit Award and has a strong interest in both astronomy and cheerleading. Murray also enjoys swimming, walking, biking, reading, music and dance.

She completed her student teaching experience in the Glens Falls Middle and Junior High Schools in 1981. She will be replacing Lance Evans who is returning to the industrial field.

## Dairy Farm Management Is Topic

The meeting will be held at the Gran-View Restaurant in Ogdensburg, the Northern New York Agricultural Development Program in conjunction with Cornell University Cooperative Extension will co-sponsor a meeting on Dairy Farm Management.

The meeting, entitled "The Challenge of the Dairy Farm Manager" will cover subjects such as semen and embryo sexing, Iso Acids (a new product developed by Eastman Kodak that has been shown to increase milk production by 8-10%), and bovine growth hormone (a product which has increased milk production by 40% in

experimental studies and may be available in the U.S. in five to six years).

They will also be discussing the impact of biotechnology as a whole on agriculture.

As a keynote address Dr. Robert Jacobson, milk marketing specialist at Ohio State University, will discuss future dairy policy.

The meeting will begin at 12:30 p.m. with registration and will continue until 9 p.m. The registration fee of \$17.50 includes a buffet dinner. If anyone has any questions or would like to make reservations, they should contact Ed Jackman at 315-267-2131.

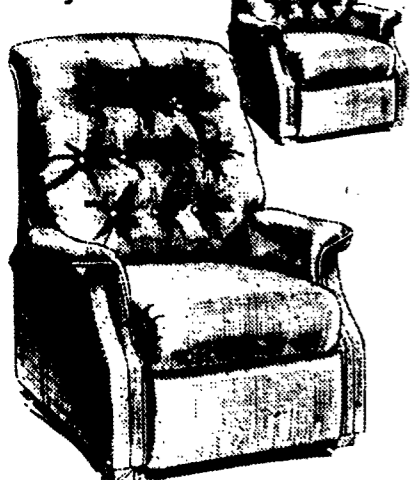

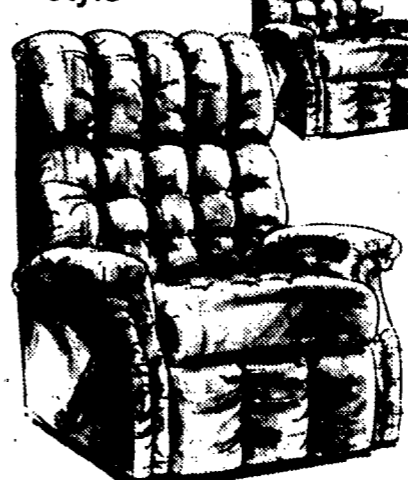

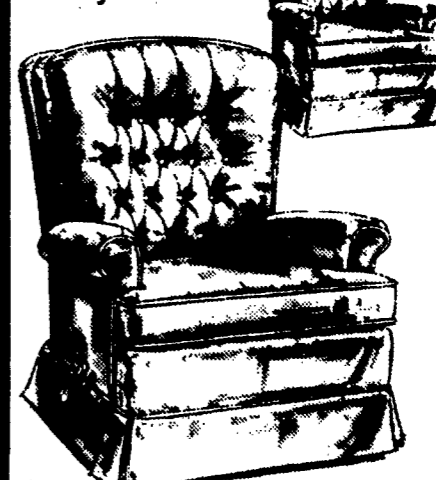
