### Norfolk Squad Notes Year's Activities

NORFOLK — The Norfolk rescue Squad has released its activity report for 1984, which details the total number and types of calls the squad made during the year.

Included in the report was a list of officers for 1985. Elected were President William Bond, Chief Richard McDougall, Assistant Chief George Harris, Secretary Laraine Robinson, and Treasurer Dominic Zappia.

In 1984, the squad made a total of 261 calls, with an average of three members responding to each call. One vehicle, referred to in the report as R-10, was used for 222 calls and traveled 5,700 miles. A second vehicle, R-11, responded to 39 calls and traveled a total of 2,400 miles.

For the year, the rescue squad reported a general decrease in calls. A motor vehicle accidents, two school accidents, three work accidents, 23 home accidents, and seven recreational accidents.

The Norfolk squad had four calls that involved patients who were dead on arrival at a local hospital, made 39 transports, was on standby 12 times, and made 31 unclassified calls.
