**STOCKHOLM** — At the regular meeting of the Stockholm Town Board held Dec. 11, in the Winthrop Municipal Building, with Supervisor Lincoln Chapman presiding, bids were opened and publicly read on surplus materials, and also on aerial spraying for control of black flies and mosquitoes.

Items were awarded to the highest bidders, including the following items to Larry Russell: sand sifter for \$56.50; a generator, \$31; and a compressor, for \$68.50. The plow box was awarded to George Flint for the amount of \$26. Dick Eakins was awarded the bucket for a 944 front-end loader in the amount of \$250.

Only one bid for aerial spraying was received from the Duflo Spray Chemical, New Bremen, in the amount of \$15,360 for four sprayings, which was accepted.

The local law no. 2 1984 providing for the administration and enforcement of the New York State Uniform Fire Prevention and Building code in the Town of Stockholm was adopted.

Bills for the month of November were read and payment approved from their respective funds as follows: general, \$4,486.30; highway, \$3,896.30; recreation, \$759.87; sewer, \$5,336.50; and trust and agency \$2,426.85.
