Man Dies In ATV Accident

A Massena man, was killed early New Year's Day after he was thrown from an all-terrain vehicle and struck his head on a fire hydrant in the village of Potsdam.

Village police say Gerald Fields, 27, of Box 512, Massena was driving his 1983 Honda three-wheeled ATV on Leroy Street in the village. He approached the intersection of May Road then apparently applied his brakes and the three-wheeler flipped over onto its side.

Fields was thrown from the ATV and police say he struck his head against a fire hydrant. He was not wearing a safety helmet at the time of the accident.

Police say two passers-by reported the accident to the Canton-Potsdam Hospital who in turn contacted village police.

Fields was taken to the hospital by the Potsdam Rescue Squad where he was reported dead on arrival at 2:55 a.m.

An investigation is continuing. Fields was at a party at the residence of Toni A. Snell in Hannawa Falls, according to police. He borrowed the ATV, which was not inspected, registered, licensed or insured, and drove to Potsdam.

Reportedly, Fields was noticed missing from the party at approximately 1 a.m. Police also said Fields was observed drinking at the party.

An autopsy performed last Wednesday at 1 p.m. by St. Lawrence County Coroner Philip E. Brown and Dr. Antonio Valero, a pathologist at the St. Lawrence Psychiatric Center, determined the cause of death to be head injuries.

Brown commented that alcohol is possibly a related cause of death but could not be certain until he received the analysis of the blood sample taken at the autopsy.

Brown also said a helmet might have lessened the severity of the blow, but he could not be sure if it would have saved his life.

He was born in Malone on Nov. 5, 1958, the son of Irma Miller and Maurice Fields. He attended Massena schools and just completed his liberal arts degree at Mater Dei College in Ogdensburg. He was a veteran of three years in the Navy and was employed in the printing department at Massena Memorial Hospital as a printer for four years.


