From 1979 to and including 1985 scholarships to high school graduating seniors totaled 87 and represented \$26,900. Masonic Brotherhood Fund from '79 through '85 totaled \$9,535, with an additional \$35 in memorials. "Think Big and Build" from '79 to '82 was given \$4,500 and scholarships, equipment and campership to Masonic Youth Camp for '82 and '83 received \$1,060. ARC summer camperships in '82 and '83 received \$360, (there were 2 each year); REACT teams in '82 received \$800; County Fair Booth in '81 \$120;

Lions Trade Fair \$125; and in '84 Norwood Brass Firemen received \$300. Benevolent gifts to families were \$25. So it all adds up to \$44,225.
