

Knights Earn Weekend Sweep Of Army, Princeton

In their most productive offensive weekend of the season, the Clarkson University hockey team began the 1986 portion of this campaign on the right note with two wins over ECAC foes.

Defeating Army 7-4 on Jan. 3 and Princeton 6-2 on Jan. 4, the Golden Knights extended their overall winning streak to three games and their league win streak to five straight.

With the two home victories, the Knights upped their overall record to 8-5-3 and climbed to the fourth spot in the ECAC with a 5-1-3 record.

Clarkson will look to continue their winning ways as they travel on the road this weekend for two league games. On Jan. 10, the Knights face-off against the ECAC's number three team—Har-

vard — in Cambridge, Mass. and on Jan. 11, the Green and Gold battle the league's 11th place team Dartmouth in Hanover, N.H.

In a penalty-filled contest against Princeton on Saturday night, which saw 19 penalties called on each team, totalling 84:00, Clarkson broke open a tight 3-2 game with three unanswered goals in the final 4:18 to coast to victory.

After the Tigers' Pat Brodeur knocked in a rebound at 4:15 of the third period to cut the Knights' lead to 3-2, Clarkson senior Derek Ray, freshman Mike Morrison, and sophomore Steve Williams keyed a Green and Gold offensive surge late in the stanza. Scoring one goal apiece, the trio helped preserve the Knights' 11th straight win over Princeton.

Clarkson took a 2-0 first period lead on the strength of sophomore Luciano Borsato's fourth and fifth goals of the season and some strong goaltending from senior Jamie Falle.

On the powerplay at 9:36, Borsato scored the first goal, tipping in a rebound from the left side of the net. Andy Otto and Jean Rouleau assisted.

The 5'11", 172-pound center ran the count to 2-0 at 12:40 when he took a centering pass from Williams and sent a wrist shot past Shea from 20 feet out.

Falle, who recorded 13 saves in the period, made two big point blank saves on the Tigers' leading scorer, John Mesauri, in the opening minute of play and at the 9:00 mark to shut out Princeton in the first period.

On a three-on-three situation at 6:10 of the second, Cliff Abrecht tallied Princeton's first ECAC goal in the second period this season, flipping one by Falle from the left side.

Clarkson countered with the eventual gamewinner at 13:52 as senior Mike Harvey lifted in a rebound for his 12th goal of the

season. Rouleau and Otto assisted on the four-on-three powerplay score.

Falle, who posted 13 saves in the period, recorded 29 for the game to earn his 58th career win.

Army Shot Down

On Friday, the Cadets of Army, under 36-year head coach Jack Riley, made their first appearance at Walker Arena in over 30 years. Unfortunately the results were the same for Riley and his troops, as Clarkson recorded their tenth straight win over Army.

As in the Princeton game, the Knights jumped out to an uncontested lead in the first period, this time striking for three unanswered goals in the opening 20:00.

Senior Bruce Tillotson, with assists from linemates Williams and Borsato, got the Knights going when he stuffed the puck between Army goaltender Paul DeGironimo's pads at 5:52 for his third goal of the season.

Chris Mills' slapshot from the left face-off circle was tipped in by freshman Rouleau from in front of

the net at 10:03 for a 2-0 lead.

Harvey closed out the first period scoring at 17:32 when he knocked in a long rebound from a Charlie Meltner shot.

Army tallied their first goal of the contest at 3:39 of the middle stanza when Matt Wilson scored on an unassisted wristshot from the right face-off circle.

The Knights then erupted for three straight goals by Harvey, Bob Lenney, and Williams to take a 6-1 lead.

Army recorded their second goal to close out the period when Dave Regan scored on a deflection from in front at 19:38.

One minute and seven seconds into the final stanza, Borsato registered his first ECAC goal of the season as he poked in a rebound from in front. Williams and Otto assisted on the powerplay score.

The Cadets made a surge with powerplay tallies by Wilson at 4:40 and Ted Moran at 7:49, but it wasn't enough as the Knights held on for the victory.

Clarkson outshot Army 36-28. Falle stopped 24 shots.

Gasbarre Honored By ICAC

Dan Gasbarre, a sophomore on the Clarkson University soccer team, was recently named to the first team of the Independent College Athletic Conference (ICAC) all-star squad for the second consecutive year.

The 6'0", 160-pound forward was the ICAC's leading scorer in 1985, tallying 30 points for the 6-7-2 Golden Knights. Gasbarre set a new Clarkson record for goals in a season with 14 and added two assists. The Rochester, N.Y. native was named the league's player of the week three times during the regular season.

A 1984 graduate of Bishop Kearney High School, Gasbarre is an industrial distribution major at Clarkson.

C-P Wins Consy

Led by Tim Doyle's 32 point scoring outburst, the Colton-Pierrepont boys basketball team defeated Knox Memorial 82-74 Saturday in the consolation game of the C-P Holiday Basketball Tournament.

Hermon-DeKalb won the tourney with a 60-49 win over Old Forge.

Brian Chamberlain helped the Colts' winning cause by contributing nine points in an All-Tourney performance.

In the first round, a scintillating comeback attempt by the Colts was thwarted by Hermon-DeKalb, as C-P dropped a 51-49 double overtime decision.

Pat Collins' shot with :02 left in the double overtime won it for H-D, which led 34-19 at the half. Marc Hayes scored 15 points to lead H-D.

Doyle and Chamberlain again were hot for the Colts, scoring 28 and 11 points, respectively.

P-H Girls Optimistic

Led by a new coach, Tim Muehl, the Parishville-Hopkinton girls basketball team is flying high with optimism.

The Panthers recently won the Madrid-Waddington Christmas Tournament and won two scrimmages with Potsdam last week.

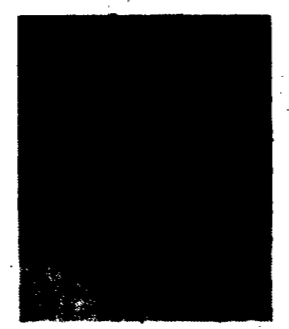

REPLACING TEETH

Q. What happens if a lost tooth is not replaced?

A. If you remove foundation blocks from a building, in time the remaining blocks shift, crumble, collapse. Lose a tooth and much the same happens. When the opposite tooth loses its chewing partner and its periodontal fibers go unused, that tooth will loosen, shift position and cause a change in the over-all bite. With an off-balance bite, some teeth impact too hard and others too lightly, and this can initiate periodontal disease. When multiple teeth are missing, the remaining teeth must carry the chewing load and work twice as hard. So when ANY teeth are lost, they must be replaced quickly to ward off trouble for the entire mouth. Regular dental checkups can help keep your teeth and gums healthy.
