Veterans Viewpoint

I have mentioned several times how difficult it is to identify clients who may be entitled to increased VA benefits. This is particularly true for people being paid pension under Public Law 86-211, commonly referred to as the "old law".

When the pension law changed on Jan. 1, 1979, people being paid under the "old law" were given the option of staying under that law or "switching" to the Improved Pension law.

In many cases, the arithmetic involved in computing the pension both ways resulted in a decision to remain under the "old law" since it was to the financial advantage of the claimant. In all too many cases, however, these people were told to "never switch to the new law" or they would be struck by a bolt of lightning or something equally disastrous.

The option of remaining under the old law also had a couple of drawbacks. Mainly, there would be no future cost of living increases and no reimbursement for excessive medical expenses. Since Jan. 1, 1979, the improved pension limit (new law) has increased over 65 percent, while the old law payment rate remained the same.

To quickly check to see if you should consider "switching" add up your gross monthly income for the family (wages, social security including \$15.50 medicare if you are covered, pensions, annuities, dividends, interest, etc.) Do not include your VA pension.

Second, subtract your gross income from whichever the following numbers applies to you: Single veteran, \$490; widow, \$328; veteran

and one dependent (wife and child), \$642; widow and one dependent, \$430.

For example, "Gunshot LaGuerre" (you all remember Gunshot) was a single veteran (divorced of course) on "old law" pensions of \$54 monthly. His other income was social security of \$410 monthly and he is covered by medicare. His gross income is \$425.50. Subtracted from \$490 leaves \$64.50. When he switched to Improved Pension, he went from \$54 to \$64 monthly, and also can get reimbursed if his medical expenses get too high.

If the result is less than your present VA pension, you should be in talking to us. If you are housebound or need an attendant, the rates are higher and you should also checked with us. Under no circumstances will you be forced or asked to change if you don't want to.

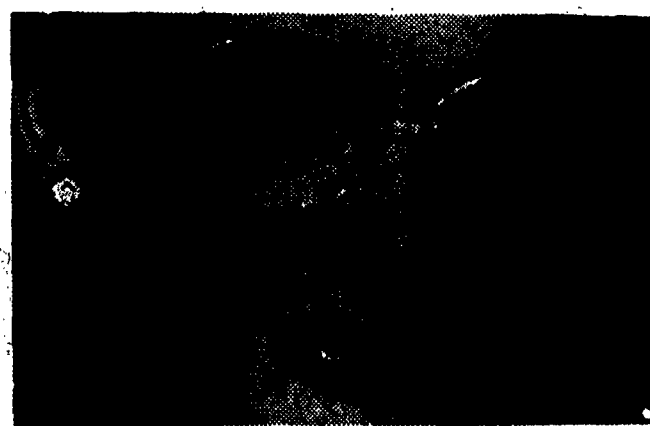
