

Norwood Highlights

The Republican village caucus will be held in Norwood at 7 p.m. on Jan. 24 in the Norwood Municipal Building.

Lorna Farnsworth, daughter of Alfred Farnsworth of 11 Pine St., Norwood, has returned home for a nine month furlough from Indonesia where she works with the Moni people.

Miss Farnsworth is working on the western half of the New Guinea island where she supervises medical work for the Moni tribe overseeing eight clinics and training personnel to help operate these clinics. The one clinic is located at Hitadipa, the other seven are scattered through the mountains, some as far as a six-day walk over the trail.

The Moni tribe, a tribe of some 25,000, live within small villages, each village having only 50 to 100 people.

Miss Farnsworth described the people as very friendly and primitive, resembling Stone Age inhabitants when she first began working on the island in 1971. Most villagers have never traveled beyond the valley in which they live but are now being slowly influenced by western culture.

Their homes are huts made of bark and a grass roof.

The Moni village children must attend elementary school until grade 3 and attend junior high or high school if they pass an entrance exam and can afford the higher schooling. The high schools and junior high schools are located only in government centers along the coastline. Children of the jungle areas have no formal education.

Their diet is mainly sweet potatoes, green vegetables, corn and squash. Pork or chicken are eaten infrequently and malnutrition among the children is prevalent.

Illnesses such as malaria, dengue fever, and amoebic dysentery also plague the people. Upon her return, Miss Farnsworth will be teaching sanitation, public health measures and the use of soybean and nuts as protein.

Miss Farnsworth is a missionary nurse with the Christian Missionary Alliance. She also has the responsibility of training pastors and Sunday School teachers.

In February and March she will be touring Virginia, Maryland and Delaware where she will be speaking and showing slides of her experiences.

She is a 1960 graduate of Norwood-Norfolk High School.




