

N-N's Revier Shines In Track Meet

Superstar Leslie Revier was once again the highlight of the Section 10 Indoor Track meet Friday at St. Lawrence University as she won three events and remained undefeated in all of them this year.

The Norwood-Norfolk senior led her Flyer girls team to a fourth place finish at the meet. The Gouverneur girls were first with 77 points, followed by Thousand Islands (of Brockville) with 66, Malone with 62, and N-N with 60. Potsdam placed a disappointing sixth with 41 points.

Revier, one of the better all-around tracksters in the state, won the long jump (17'11"), triple jump (35'2.25"), and the 300 yard dash (44.1). The Flyer mile relay team was victorious with a time of 4:38.2. Other fine performances came from Canton's Sue Thompson with a 5'2" effort in the high jump and Debbie Lauzon, of Salmon River, with a nifty 5:03.2 time in the 1500 yard run.

On the boys side of the ledger, N-N placed second with 92 points, behind powerful Malone's 118 points. OFA was third (66.5), followed by Thousand Islands (49.5), Massena (30), Potsdam

CANTON — Tony Bjork, a St. Lawrence University freshman from Ogdensburg, led a field of 159 runners to win the second Frozen Foote four-mile road race held last Saturday on the hilly Woodmere Road course in Canton.

Bjork, a former OFA star, ran a personal best time of 20:16 to edge Madrid's Dan Dominie by four seconds. Competing in his 30th

straight Frozen Foote race, Dominie clocked 20:20 for second place while SLU All-American Marty Dumoulin of Massena took third in 20:40.

The women's competition produced a blanket finish as Paity Myers of Norfolk and Angie O'Neill of Massena High School finished together with identical times of 27:56. Kara Rusch of Gouverneur ran a time of 28:08 to capture third place.

The youngest runner was eight-year-old Paul Twyman in 35:43 while 61-year-old James Latimer of Pierrepont led the senior runners in 35:09.

Ruth Baltus, of Potsdam, finished first in the 30-39 age group with a time of 27:55.

The derby will be held on Feb. 22 and 23 with registration and other festival events centered at the Village Dock on Morristown Bay. Fishing hours will be from 7 a.m. to 4 p.m. Saturday and 7 a.m. to 3 p.m. Sunday. Fees to enter the two day contest will be \$5 for adults, \$2 for young fishermen up to 12 year-olds, or \$5 for the entire family.

A new \$500 Mercury 2.2 outboard motor is the reward for the largest Great Northern landed in the adult fishing class and the youngsters will be going for a premium casting rod and reel as first prize.

For those who like their winter fun to be more strenuous there will be ice skating and cross country ski races on the Upper Bay. There will be ice sculptures to view and to ward off the cold — hamburgers, hot dogs, chili, beer and soft drink will be available at dock side.
