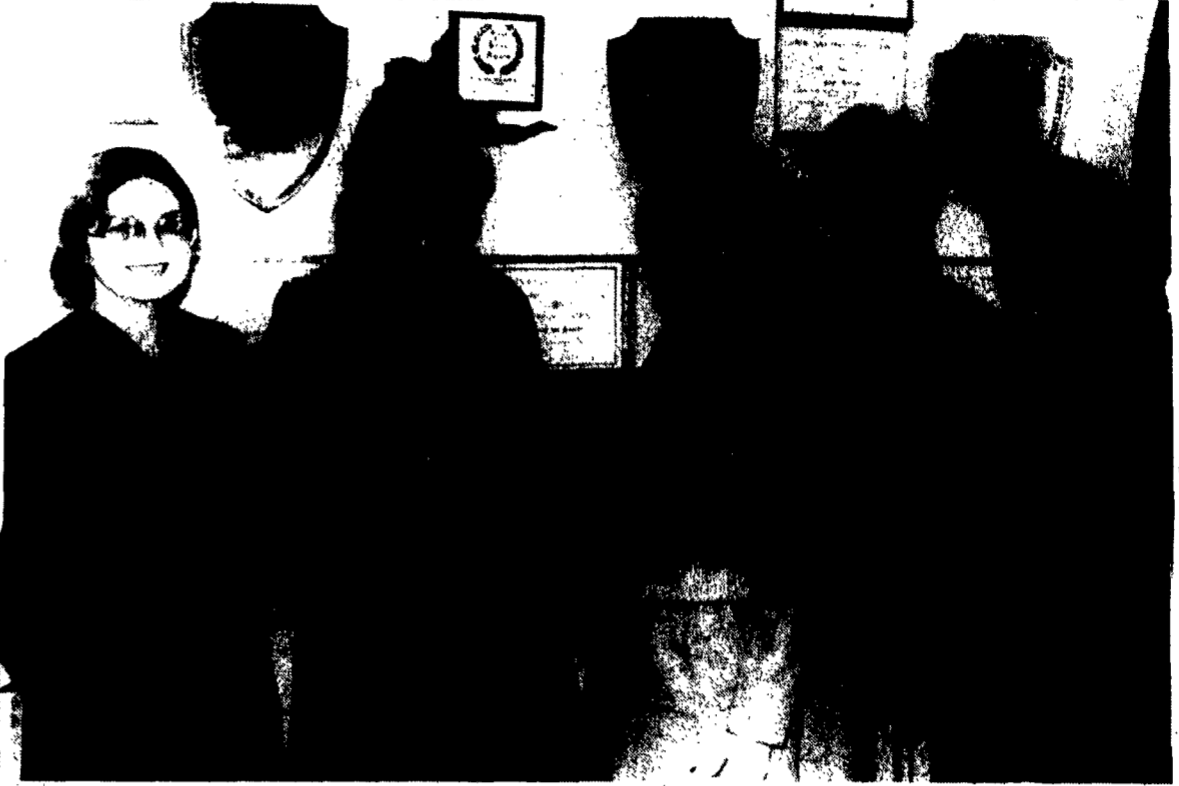
Peter Fiacco, 70 South Main St., Norwood, has returned home after being a patient in the Canton-Potsdam Hospital where he was ill with pneumonia.

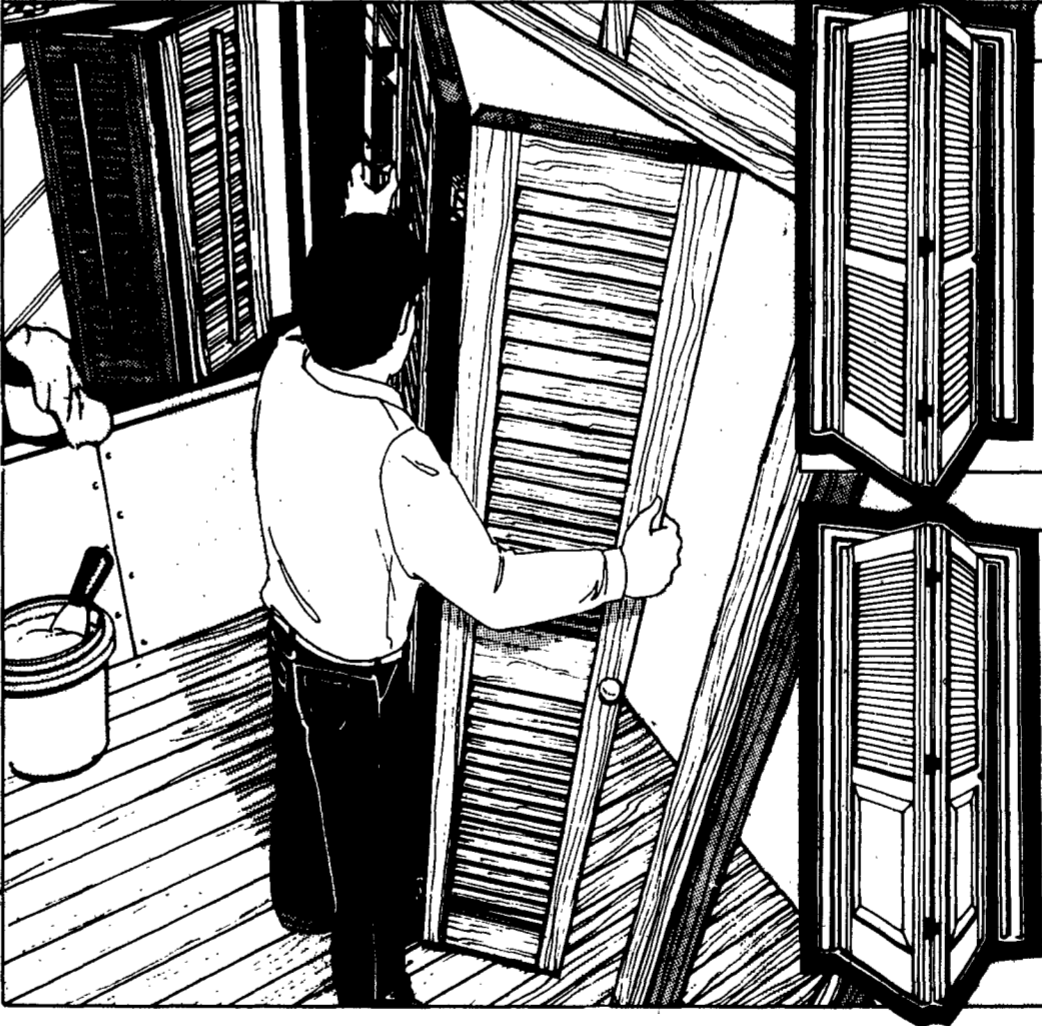
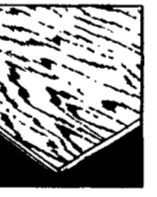
