After a rigorous seven-game road trip, the Clarkson University hockey team finally returns home this weekend. The Knights, who last played at Walker Arena on Nov. 28, host ECAC foes Dartmouth on Friday and top-rated Harvard Saturday. Both games begin at 7:30 p.m.

Clarkson's lengthiest road trip in two years ended on a disastrous note as the Green and Gold saw two long-standing winning streaks end and one current losing trend continue.

Both Princeton and Army have seen their share of hard times against the Knights, with each team holding multiple game losing streaks to Clarkson. However, this past weekend, the two emerging ECAC squads put a halt to those losing ways with upset victories over the Knights.

On Friday, Princeton defeated Clarkson 6-4 to snap a 12-game losing streak, dating back to Feb. 29, 1976. And on Saturday, Army won for the first time over the Knights since 1948, breaking a 10-game losing skid with a 6-3 victory.

In the midst of a four-game losing slump (its longest since a six-game skid during the 1982-83 campaign), Clarkson fell to under .500 overall for the first time this season.

After junior Rodger Hulatt, from Norwood, connected off assists from linemates Luciano Borsato and Steve Williams to pull the Knights to within one, at 3:53 of the

12-team pack with a 4-5 mark. Falling behind early and surrendering the powerplay goal was the undoing for head coach Cap Raeder's skaters over the weekend.

Against Princeton, the Knights trailed 2-0 midway through the first period before sophomore Shawn LaVoy knocked in a rebound off an Al Hill shot during a scramble in front at 16:59.

The Tigers, who had jumped out to the fast start on goals by John Messuri, at 1:57, and Greg Polaski, at 10:20, extended the lead to 3-1 when Messuri scored again with 20 seconds left in the opening period.

Clarkson mounted a comeback in the final period when Williams scored from the right side 34 seconds after the face-off. Borsato and Hulatt assisted. Freshman Mark Tretowicz, on a 5-3 Clarkson powerplay, closed the gap to 5-4 as he beat Tiger goalie Dave Shea low to the stick side at 6:29.

Princeton was not about to let the victory slip away, however, as Messuri, last year's ECAC Rookie of the Year, completed his hat trick with a powerplay goal at 10:30, to give the Tigers a two-goal advantage.

Clarkson outshot Princeton 43-29. Freshman John Fletcher started the game in goal for the Knights, making five first period saves.
